Ms. Deborah Cheetham AM- the world renowned Aboriginal Opera singer, composer, playwright and creator of the first Aboriginal opera

Dr. Eva Eden AM- A distinguished and world renowned scientist, lecturer and administrator.

Dr. Olga Kanitsaki AM- A distinguished retired nurse with a 40 year career devoted to cultural-sensitive health services.

Mrs. Malvina Malinek OAM- Advocate for the rights of women locally, nationally and internationally for over 50 years.

Emeritus Professor Anne Mitchell AO- A community educator and development worker for over 20 years in the field of sexual health.

Profile of DR D. Geoffrey Neilson AM GCSJ FCA, FCPA, ACIS, FTIA

I am pleased to be able to provide a snap shot account of our Barwon Regional Group member Dr Donald Geoffrey Neilson AM, known to everybody by his second Christian name – Geoff.

He is the son of the late Donald Ferguson Neilson and Grace Elizabeth nee Barber, and in early life was a day student at the Geelong College from 1935 to 1947, a member of the cricket, football and athletic teams, and winner of the Dr Gus Kearney Memorial Prize.

Soon after leaving School, he became Treasurer of the OGCA (Old Geelong Collegians Association), later Secretary and President. Geoff has been a member of the College Council from 1960 to 1980 and its Chairman from 1978-1980.

His dedication and contribution to the College was recognised when he was elected a Fellow of the OGCA and in December 2003, when he was appointed a

Life Governor of the Geelong College. An annually awarded academic prize is named in honour of Geoff Nielson: The D Geoffrey Neilson Prize for Accounting. His portrait hangs in the Geelong College Senior School Dining Hall.

Geoff began his accountancy career 'as a junior clerk in his father's and uncle's accountancy firm, Nielson and Nielson, in 1948. He studied for the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia examinations with the Hemingway Robertson Institute going on to win the Victorian Intermediate Prize in 1949. In 1952, he completed his exams. Geoff also gained second place in Victoria and first place in Victoria in intermediate auditing.

He then completed the Institute of Chartered Secretaries examinations. Geoff's father died in July, 1953 and six years later his uncle died leaving Geoff the solepartner of the firm until 1962, when he decided to merge his business with Howard Day, Glyn Jenkins, and Graham Johns. In 1955, he married Glenda Elizabeth Moyle.

In the early 1960s, Geoff became interested in farm accountancy, attending a short course at the University of New England and becoming a member of the Australian Committee for Coding Rural Accounts, and presenting papers on the subject at several conferences. He followed this up by writing the third edition of the Law Book Company's title Principles and Practice of Farm Management Accounting.

He has been strongly involved in both the Victorian and National Institutes of Chartered Accountants. He became a member of the National Council in 1977, elected to the Executive in 1978, and elected President in 1980-81. He has also represented the two major Australian accounting bodies on the executive committee of the Conference of Asian and Pacific Accountants and the Institute of the Victorian Council of Professions.

His community involvement is considerable. He has been a member of the Council of Deakin University and Secretary to the Councils of Morongo Girls' College and Marcus Oldham Farm Management College. Geoff is a past President of Geelong YMCA from 1966 to 1968 and of the Rotary Club of Geelong 1971 to 1972; the first chairman of the Geelong Business Awards in 1984.

He was made a Member of the Order of Australia in 1985 for services to accountancy and a Knight of the Sovereign of St John in 1995 for service to the

community. He was elected Victorian Chairman of The Order of Australia Association from 2006 to 2008, and is a supportive member of the Barwon Regional Group of the Order of Australia Association.

Geoff was acknowledged for his distinguished service to Marcus Oldham over the institution's first 50 years of operation. Many students will remember Geoff as their part-time lecturer in Tax and Estate Planning. Geoff also held the position of Secretary to Council from the commencement of the College in 1962 until 2012. Geoff was officially recognised for his service with the opening of the new administration building – The Geoff Neilson Centre. Geoff's enormous contribution over the decades has gone a long way in ensuring that Marcus Oldham remains the pre-eminent agricultural, agribusiness and equine management college in Australia.

Geoff has also been involved with the Geelong Community Foundation since 1997 when he agreed to chair a steering group of 15 members to investigate the concept of a Community Foundation for Geelong. He was a long serving boardmember and founding Chairman. Geoff continued as Chairman until 2005 and remained a very active board member and committee chairman until retiring in November 2011.

He is an inaugural and current Trustee of the Geelong Advertiser Music Scholarship Trust which was established in 1991; he currently serves as the Geelong Chamber of Commerce's Chair of Finance & Audit Committee/Public Policy Committee; and is a generous supporter of the Geelong Performing Arts Centre.

Geoff is a long serving and faithful member of the Uniting Church in Australia – at St David's, Newtown where he has served as Treasurer, Choir Member, and Council Member. He is the author of a number of publications including "Journey of Faith: St. David's Uniting Church, Newtown 1851 – 2001".

Through a generous arrangement orchestrated by Geoff, our meetings of the Barwon Regional Group Committee continue to be hosted in the Board Room at the offices of his former business, now owned by Crowe Howarth.

The above information merely details some of the extraordinary commitment to the wider Barwon Region and beyond, made by this outstanding member of the Order of Australia Association.
