Australia Day 2016 flag march past and flag lowering service

Guest speaker at this coming year's Australia Day event will be Professor Antonio (Tony) Giuseppe Sagona AM, B.A (Hons), Dip. Ed., PhD, FSA, FAHA (pictured).Professor Sagona presently leads a major field project on the Gallipoli Peninsula

This Joint Historical and Archaeological Survey of the ANZAC Battlefield, is a unique project tasked with recording the remnant features of the ANZAC campaign. Both his standing in archaeology and his connections with Turkey, led to the Australian Government inviting him to direct the fieldwork.



Despite the centrality that the Gallipoli Peninsula and the 1915 campaign have in the psyche of many Australians, the Battlefield itself has not been studied in great detail. Utilising non-invasive survey techniques and a multi-disciplinary approach, the project is opening a new chapter in the ANZAC story.

This tri-nation project, involving Australian, Turkish and New Zealand experts, is funded by the Department of Veterans' Affairs (Canberra), and welcomed by Turkish authorities.

What is unique about this field project, is that the survey work is being undertaken using Global Positioning Systems (GPS), on both sides of the battlefield.

The results tell a rich but sad story of a conflict of our involvement as a Nation, on these distant shores

Member survey

The Victoria Branch Committee has been anxious to distribute as much news as possible electronically. Consequently, in September the branch mailed 681 letters (together with reply-paid envelopes) to members who did not have an email address listed in the National Membership database. By the end of November 120 members had provided email addresses, and 10 more had indicated that they would read the Victorian newsletter on the OAA website. This has resulted in the ability to communicate with 70% of Victorian members electronically.

Nearly 200 people attended the Remembrance Day service in the Geelong Peace Memorial at Johnstone Park reflecting on the sacrifice of those who fought and fell in battle and remembering the freedom we experience today came at a price.

Geelong RSL Sub-Branch President Andrew Hanns led the service, Geelong Mayor Darryn Lyons gave the address and Major Anthony Paul Krupa (R'td) was an inspiring guest speaker. Both made reference to Remembrance Day being an important day to stop and to honour the men and women who have served, or are serving Australia in our Defence Forces.

Major Krupa who has served with distinction during operations in East Timor, Iraq and Afghanistan, said it was time to reflect on those who made the ultimate sacrifice and also remember those who lived but suffered physical and or psychological challenges. "The injuries you don't see are those that haunt our service men and women in ways that only those who suffered, can truly understand" Major Krupa said.

The service also included dedications, the Ode, Last Post, reflective silence and laying of more than 25 wreaths. Barbara Abley AM layed the wreath on behalf of the OAA Barwon Regional Group. The Mayor hosted a light finger food lunch at City Hall after the Remembrance Day Service.

His message of hope in the developing world as a result of improvements in health, especially through control of infectious diseases, was most uplifting. Prior to his speech, a toast to France following the recent terrorist attacks, was conducted in the presence of the French chef, Michel Renoux.
