# 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Report

#### 1. Introduction

It gives me great pleasure to present the thirty-fifth Annual Report of the Queensland Branch of The Order of Australia Association in my first year as Chairman.

It has been another busy year with a great variety of events organized by a hard working branch committee. Our regional groups continued to provide great service to the lifeblood of our members throughout the year. The national board meeting held in Perth in March this year approved the formation of our eighth regional group – The Mackay-Whitsunday Regional Group and the group organized its first event in June this year at the home of Carmel Daveson AM, its Convener.

The Branch organized two outstanding celebratory lunches for new award recipients during the year with a record attendance of 271 guests at the event in May and 103 at the one held during September. Two wonderful Brisbane morning teas were also arranged; a visit to the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) Amberley Air Base in April and the Queensland Club in August with 64 and 61 attendees respectively

The Secondary Schools Citizenship Awards (SSCAs) and the Senior Volunteer Awards were maintained in 2015. It was pleasing that the Governor of Queensland His Excellency the Honourable Paul de Jersey AC, accepted our invitation to present the SSCAs to the winning students at Parliament House on 18 September.

These and other events organized during the year in Brisbane and also in the eight regions are reported in greater detail in the body of this report.

There were seven well attended committee meetings throughout the year and all were held in the community meeting room, Toowong Library, Toowong Village, Toowong, Brisbane at no cost to the Association. In addition, the appointments of Treasurer and Director of the national Board were determined by "flying minutes" held between the AGM and the meeting held on 21 January 2015 with the decision ratified at the 21 January 2015 meeting.

#### 3. The 2014 Annual Dinner

The event was held again at The Pavilion, Allan Border Field, Albion, in Brisbane on Monday, 24 November 2014. There is a considerable advantage in choosing a Monday rather than a Friday night because The Pavilion is able to drop the usual price by \$10 per person.

The 103 guests enjoyed good food, great fellowship and an excellent after dinner presentation by our special guest Tim Fairfax AC.

While all of these aspects were memorable, the highlight of the evening was the announcement of the three winners of the 2014 Senior Volunteer Awards presented by the Queensland branch and proudly sponsored by CoxRayner, Architects.

# 4. The Luncheons to celebrate with recipients of awards in the Order of Australia

The branch committee organized two excellent luncheons to celebrate with new recipients of awards in the Order of Australia; one for Australia Day recipients in May 2015 at the Broncos Leagues Club and the other for Queen's Birthday recipients at Hillstone St Lucia in September 2015. These were very successful and key events in the Queensland branch calendar.

# 4.1 The Luncheon to celebrate with recipients of awards in the 2015 Australia Day Honours

Thirty-three of 93 Queensland recipients of Order of Australia Awards in this year's Australia Day honours were special guests at the Luncheon on Friday 8 May 2015 at Hillstone St Lucia. A record 271 people attended the gala event including the recipients, their families and friends and 26 Association members and their guests. At the equivalent event last year there were 166 attendees and 27 new recipients. The increase this time round is extremely pleasing to report, helped in part by the increase in new recipient numbers and several large award recipient contingents in attendance.

A highlight of the event was the performance by the six member Celli Choir from Kelvin Grove State College; who provided lovely background music on arrival and then a stirring rendition of the first two verses of the National Anthem which we sang with great voice. On behalf of the Queensland Branch I presented each of the musicians with a special Certificate of Participation.

# 4.2 The Luncheon to celebrate with recipients of awards in the 2015 Queen's Birthday Honours

Sixteen of 57 Queensland recipients of Order of Australia Awards in this year's Queen's Birthday honours were special guests at the Luncheon on Wednesday 23 September 2015 at Hillstone St Lucia. One hundred and three people attended the gala event including the recipients, their families and friends and 8 Association members and their guests. At the equivalent event last year there were 182 attendees and 30 new recipients. The lower numbers at this year's event can be attributed to the low number of new awardees in this year's Queen's Birthday honours.

We were entertained on this occasion on arrival at the Mango Terrace by the the Strings A Ensemble from St Aidan's Anglican Girls' School, Corinda. They also provided the music for the singing of the National Anthem and it was especially pleasing that the performers agreed to take time from their school holidays to perform for us.

# 5. 2013 Secondary Schools Citizenship Awards (SSCA)

Honeycombe's Property Group after providing over 10 years of continous sponsorship of these awards ceased their sponsorship this year. As an Association we are indebted to Peter Honeycombe and the Honeycombe's Property Group for their interest and very strong support of these awards over many years. I am pleased to announce that Mr Tim Fairfax AC, kindly agreed to take up sponsorship of these awards for this year and also for 2016 and 2017. This means that this excellent initiative will continue for the next two years.

This year we had 102 people attend the 17<sup>th</sup> annual Presentation of awards, comprising secondary school students, family members, education representatives and OAA members from across Queensland.

The event was held on Friday 18 September 2014 at Parliament House, Brisbane. Guest of Honour, His Excellency the Honourable Paul de Jersey AC, Governor of Queensland presented 11 students with commemorative plaques and Certificates of Merit, and Mr Tim Fairfax AC, our new awards sponsor presented Certificates of Community Service to 9 selected local students. Mr Peter Fullagar, Headmaster, St Joseph's Nudgee College presented the response speech on behalf of the Schools.

Nominations were received for 79 students from 49 secondary schools throughout Queensland, compared with 70 nominations representing 45 schools last year. This year's judging panel again comprised Mrs Dina Browne AO and Mr Bruce Howden OAM from the Association and Mr Chris Lassig from Education Queensland. The Association thanks all three judges for their contribution. To Geoff Cowles OAM, thank you for agreeing to again add to your considerable workload as Secretary by tackling with such enthusiasm the coordination role of this year's awards program.

This year's presentation was compered by Bruce Howden OAM, one of this year's judges who stepped in at the last minute to replace Mr Howard Ainsworth AM, our regular MC, who passed away suddenly. The event was made special by the presence of Guitar and Clarinet ensembles from St Joseph's Nudgee College providing musical interludes and the playing of the National Anthem. All ensemble members received Certificates of Participation from the Association.

Daniel O'Brien from Moreton Bay Boys' College, who received a Secondary Schools Citizenship Award, was unable to attend the Presentation at Parliament House as he was performing active community service with his College raising funds for Camp Quality on the day of the ceremony. Mr Tony Wood, Head of College received the award from His Excellency on Daniel's behalf.

Geoff Cowles OAM, the Secretary, represented the Association on 28 October 2015 at Brisbane Boys' College and presented four Certificates of Community Service to their four unsuccessful nominees at their end of year College Assembly.

### 9. Membership Trends

There were 150 Queensland recipients who received awards in the Order of Australia in 2015 and 60 of these are now members of The Order of Australia Association. This represents 40% of the total number of Queensland recipients joining the Association compared with 45.7% last year (80 of 175 recipients joining). New recipients joining as members this year are 5.7% down on last year.

In 2015 we welcomed 49 Queensland recipients at our two lunches in May and September and of these 30 (61.2%) joined the Association. In 2014 the percentage of lunch recipients joining was 77.2% (44 of 57 recipients attending the lunches). The uptake of memberships by lunch recipients was much lower this year. The branch committee works hard to encourage new award recipients to join the Association and will continue to do so in 2016.

In November 2014 the total number of Queensland Branch members with up to date address listings was 1104. In November 2015 the total is 1092 which is a 2% reduction in membership. A disturbing statistic not included in the 1092 current members is a total of 104 current members, mostly life members who have either moved residences and have not provided their new addresses or they have passed away and the Association is unaware of this situation.

Professor Liz Harman AO, the Far North Queensland Regional Group Convener, represented the Queensland Branch at a very significant Investiture in Cairns on 27 May 2015 where fourteen awardees were able to attend, to be presented awards listed in the 2015 Australia Day Honours for their unstinting work in and for Cape York Indigenous communities through the work of the Family Responsibilities Commission (FRC). This agency established in 2008 is a key element of Cape York Welfare Reform. The awards were presented by His Excellency the Honourable Paul de Jersey AC, Governor of Queensland.

Mr Ron Crew OAM, a long standing member of the Far North Queensland Regional Group, represented the Queensland Branch at the Investiture Ceremony in Cairns on 16 October 2015 where North Queensland award recipients in the 2015 Queen's Birthday Honours were presented their awards by His Excellency, the Governor of Queensland.

#### 11.2 Government House Open Days

There was no Open Day organized for Australia day this year because Government House was undergoing renovations. The Open Day held in June was not the traditional Queensland Day celebration but was celebrating 150 years of Government House. As such, outside organizations were not invited to participate with promotional stalls on this day.

# 11.3 Other significant events at Government House where the Queensland Branch had representation

Di and I were honoured to be invited by His Excellency, the Honourable Paul de Jersey AC, the Governor of Queensland and Mrs Kaye de Jersey to a formal dinner held at Government House on 7 May 2015 in honour of the Officers of the Order of Australia (AO) announced in the 2015 Australia Day Honours list.

I was also honoured to be invited to Government House on 9 September to attend a special Dinner hosted by His Excellency, the Governor of Queensland to celebrate the great occasion when Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II became the longest serving British Monarch.

Geoff Cowles OAM, the Secretary, represented the Queensland Branch at a Reception for the Governor's patronage organisations held in the Investiture Room of Government House on 30 March 2015.

#### 12. Branch Communications

#### **12.1** The Order Magazine

During the year the Queensland Branch joined with the other State and Territory Branches in the 12 month trial where dedicated Queensland pages were incorporated along with pages for the other States and Territories in an expanded version of *The Order*, the national magazine, which was produced 4 times a year.

The trial provided difficulties for the Queensland Branch in that the production dates of 15 August; 15 November; 15 February and 15 May did not align with Queensland Branch events, to the extent that the inclusion in each edition of any promotional flyers for these events would result in Queensland members receiving information about events far too late to make bookings. On the one occasion that the Queensland Branch asked for two flyers to be included in the August 2015 edition of *The Order* the flyers did not reach the Queensland members.

The Queensland Branch Committee continued its practice of providing Queensland members with two Communiqués, accompanied by promotional flyers for events; one in March and the other in early October 2015. By doing so, the Queensland Branch has been successful in maintaining its high attendance numbers to its events; an outcome it believes would not have occurred had the Branch relied solely on the 4 pages in the expanded national magazine. The postage for the Communiqué has come at an additional cost to the Queensland Branch; however it has been an expense well justified.

The 12 month trial ended when the August 2015 edition was published. Subsequently at the national board level it was decided to make the trial arrangements permanent and to maintain four editions annually. The Queensland Branch Committee would have preferred to have reduced the number to three which would have given much needed breathing space for Branch editors seeking new material for their pages, not to mention that the move would have resulted in 25% less expenses in producing the magazine for members.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to both Paul McNally OAM, the Queensland Branch newsletter editor and Geoff Cowles OAM, the Secretary. They have had to overcome a number of challenges in dealing with the national editor in the production of the four Queensland pages with stricter deadlines and less flexibility than were available when producing our own Bulletin newsletter.

#### 12.2 Communicating to members via the Association website

The Queensland segment of the website was again maintained by Phil Morrall AM, the national webmaster, relying heavily on material provided by Geoff Cowles OAM, our Secretary. The website contains lots of advice about upcoming events as well as information and nomination forms for both the Secondary Schools Citizenship Awards and the Senior Volunteer Awards. Archival material has been kept up to date as far as was practicable.

The section on regional groups has been upgraded to show in greater detail the locations of each of the eight Queensland regional groups. It also now includes a very clear statement that any member from throughout Australia including Queensland may attend any regional group or metro capital city activity regardless of where they live. The opportunity for travelling members to attend events being organized during their travels is greatly encouraged.

I urge members to make it a habit to visit our website from time to time to keep up to date with what is happening in the Association, particularly national matters.

# 13. Branch activity at national level

I was very pleased to be a part of the 18 strong contingent from the Queensland branch that attended the national conference in Perth from 20 to 22 March. Last year we had 20 attendees and I am looking forward to a good number attending the 2016 conference to be held in Sydney, New South Wales in March. The 2015 conference was well organized by the Western Australian branch and was an outstanding success. My thanks to Major General Barry Nunn AO for convening the very successful conference in Western Australia and for sharing with us the programmes they developed to manage the conference to assist us with the 2017 Conference to be held in Brisbane. At this point in my report it is appropriate to advise that under the fine stewardship of Mick Davis AM ASM the Queensland Branch Conference Committee has plans well advanced for the 2017 Conference which will be held in Brisbane from 20 to 23 April 2017.

On 19 March, the day before the Perth conference, I attended the national board meeting that was held at the conference venue.
