Message from the Chairman

It is some time since we have had a Branch members' newsletter having relied on the Regional Groups and the National magazine *The Order* to keep in contact so I thought it timely to bring you this newsletter.

The National Conference held in Hobart was attended by 189 members and partners from all states and territories (including 72 from Tasmania) was a great success enjoyed by all. The positive feedback received has been much appreciated by the organising committee members who all worked very hard to ensure the event ran smoothly.

Joining me on the Conference Committee were Mrs Maureen Rudge OAM (Secretary), Mr Ron Blake OAM (Treasurer), Mr David Brill AM, Mrs Sue Cox AM, Mrs Margaret Gibbs OAM, Dr Mike Hodgson AM and Mr Bob Thorpe OAM.

One of the agreed conditions for running a conference is sharing on a 50/50 basis any surplus funds with our National Association. After initial concerns that we might not attract sufficient registrations, the final attendance level together with valuable support from sponsors has allowed the Tasmanian Branch to remit \$8,560.26 to our National accounts.

New Association Scholarship

The OAA National Board has agreed to establish an Association Scholarship within the Order of Australia Association Foundation. Funds will be set aside for an annual Association award of \$40,000 adding to the valuable work of the Foundation in supporting exceptional students.

It is hoped the first Association scholarship will be awarded next May at the Darwin National Conference.
