The citation on Charlotte's certificate reads:

A recipient of the valued Bronze, Silver and Gold Character Service and Influence Awards during her College years, Charlotte has contributed enthusiastically to many fundraising events, has organised and participated in numerous House, sporting, drama, music and other College events, has been a valued mentor to younger students and has been a College Prefect and a Petty Officer with the Australian Navy Cadets.

A wonderful role model for all in citizenship.

Charlotte said, "I would also once more like to reiterate my many thanks for this award and I feel very blessed to have been so honoured. This is a very prestigious award and I am ever grateful!".

STUDENT CITIZENSHIP AWARD PRESENTATIONS

In keeping with the aim of the Association to raise awareness about the Order of Australia, each school/college was encouraged to invite a member of the Association to attend a suitable school end-of-year graduation or valedictory assembly. Fortunately, some were able to do this before another COVID lock-down was imposed. In most cases however, the Top 10 awards and 'Highly Commended' certificates have been delivered to the school to be posted out or presented in a live-streamed award ceremony with minimal invited guests.

Paul Rosenzweig OAM, who was to have presented a 'Highly Commended' certificate to Fatima Shah of Thebarton Senior College, instead viewed Fatima receiving her award from Principal Eva Kannis-Torry in a live-streamed Year 12 Graduation Ceremony on Friday 4 December (above).

Fatima Shah has been described as a born leader who strives to create harmony and peace through youth and community engagement.

As an Afghan Hazara refugee, Fatima continuously works to improve her English and use these skills, along with her ability to fluently speak Dari, Hazargi, Farsi, and Urdu, to help others.

Fatima received the Student Citizenship Award 'Highly Commended' certificate for her service as a member of the Thebarton Senior College Youth Reference Council, engaged with Survivors of Torture and Trauma Assistance and Rehabilitation Service (STTARS).

Fatima has been a student representative on the college's governing council since 2017, and has taken an active role in the 'Student Voice' peer mentoring program.

Fatima also co-founded a women's well-being group where women from various cultures come together for activities such as yoga, dance and group discussions.

Additionally, Fatima represents her community in the 'On the Same Wave Program' at West Beach Surf Life Saving Club.

In the same graduation ceremony, Fatima also received the 'Adelaide Award' sponsored by the Federal Member for Adelaide, Mr Steve Georganas MP, awarded for her outstanding commitment to college activities, her strive for outstanding results and attendance and participation in classes.

Fatima also achieved recognition earlier last year when she was awarded the Australia Day Council of South Australia's 2020 Award for Leadership in Languages and Cultures 'Student Award'. Congratulations Fatima on your achievements!

Our Guest Speaker will be Professor Anthony Thomas AC, Elder Professor of Physics at the University of Adelaide.

Professor Thomas is an Australian Research Council Australian Laureate Fellow and Elder Professor of Physics at the University of Adelaide.

His specific areas of expertise are in high energy and particle physics, nuclear physics, mathematical modelling and complex systems. He has been a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Science since 1990, a Fellow of the UK Institute of Physics and the Australian institute of Physics.

His awards include the Walter Boas Medal, Lyle Medal, Massie Medal, Inaugural Silver Jubilee Convocation Medal of Flinders University and the Centenary Medal. In 2014, Professor Thomas was recognised as South Australian Scientist of the Year.

In 2020, Professor Thomas was appointed a Companion of the Order of Australia for his eminent service to scientific education and research, particularly in the field of nuclear and particle physics, through academic leadership roles.
