# AUSTRALIA DAY LUNCHEON Professor Anthony Thomas AC

The Guest Speaker for the SA Branch Australia Day luncheon at the Arkaba Hotel on Saturday 23 January will be Professor Anthony Thomas AC.

Professor Thomas is an Australian Research Council Australian Laureate Fellow and Elder Professor of Physics at the University of Adelaide. His specific areas of expertise are in high energy and particle physics, nuclear physics, mathematical modelling and complex systems.

He has been a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Science since 1990, a Fellow of the UK Institute of Physics and the Australian institute of Physics. His awards include the Walter Boas Medal, Lyle Medal, Massie Medal, Inaugural Silver Jubilee Convocation Medal of Flinders University and the Centenary Medal.

In 2014 he was recognised as South Australian Scientist of the Year. In 2020, Professor Thomas was appointed a Companion of the Order of Australia for his eminent service to scientific education and research, particularly in the field of nuclear and particle physics, through academic leadership roles.



#### STUDENT CITIZENSHIP AWARDS 2020

In keeping with the aim of the Association to raise awareness about the Order of Australia, each school/college was recently encouraged to invite a member of the Association to attend a suitable End of Year or Valedictory Assembly.

Some members were able to do this early in Term 4 before the most recent COVID lock-down was imposed. The rest of the 'Highly Commended' certificates are being delivered to the schools to be either posted out, or presented in a live-streamed award ceremony with minimal invited guests in attendance.

## THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA Did you know...?

In certain circumstances, a person who has twice received the Order of Australia may retain and wear both insignia – and use both post-nominals.

The Constitution of the Order allows members to wear the insignia of their award and use the relevant post-nominal letters after their name.

The Constitution also prescribes that if a member is subsequently appointed to a higher grade *in the same division* they may only wear the insignia and use the post-nominals of the higher award.

Appointments in two divisions. Prior to 1993, this provision also applied to a member who was subsequently appointed to the Order or awarded the Medal in a different division. The Insignia Ordinance in force up to that time did allow that person to wear both insignia, but nothing was said about post-nominals — so by convention only the post-nominals of the higher award were used.

At that time, Government House Darwin was preparing an honour board with framed photographs of all former Administrators and Government Residents. Among them was Commodore Eric Eugene Johnston, the thirteenth Administrator of the Northern Territory.

As a naval officer, Commodore Johnston had been appointed an Officer of the Order of the British Empire in the Military Division (OBE, 1970) and a Member of the Order of Australia in the Military Division (AM, 1975) – and accordingly used the postnominals "AM OBE RANEM" (RANEM stands for 'Royal Australian Navy Emergency List of Officers').

On 13 June 1988, for his service as Administrator, Commodore Johnston was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia in the General Division (AO), "For service to the Crown and to the people of the Northern Territory". In accordance with the extant Insignia Ordinance, he correctly wore the insignia of both his AO (General Division) and AM (Military Division). Following the convention in place at that time, his formal title became 'Commodore Eric Johnston AO OBE RANEM'.

However, in preparing the honour board, the question was asked – if Commodore Johnston was authorised to wear the insignia of *both* divisions, why should he not use *both* post-nominals. The Insignia Ordinance did not specifically preclude this.

On request, Government House Canberra approved the use of post-nominals for both divisions, using the designation '(Mil)' to distinguish the AM as an award in the Military Division.

Thus his correct title became 'Commodore Eric Johnston AO AM(Mil) OBE RANEM'.

Since 1993, the 'Designations and Insignia Ordinance' has allowed that a member of the Order in one division, who is subsequently appointed to the other division, is entitled to use the postnominals of both awards, with explanatory parentheses applied to the lower award.

<u>For example</u>: if a person who is an Officer in the Military Division is subsequently appointed a Companion in the General Division, they may use the post-nominals 'AC AO(Mil)'.

Similarly, a holder of the Medal who is subsequently appointed to the Order at any grade in the other Division may use the post-nominals of both awards with parentheses applied to the lower award.

<u>For example</u>: if a person who holds the OAM in the General Division is subsequently appointed a Member in the Military Division (AM), they may use the post-nominals 'AM OAM(Gen)'.
