Ross Newton OAM introduced our speaker Roger Wilson OAM who spoke on the topic that is so dear to his heart – rowing!

Roger gave a brief resume of his business activities starting with Kraft Foods where he was the youngest Manager at 22, from there to Luxor of Sweden selling electronic goods then Simmons Beauty Rest Bedding, Van Treight Furniture and then his final working career as CEO of Forty Winks a franchise that he built up from 17 stores to 93 stores Australia wide. Roger was in that position for 21 years.

Roger was a keen rower at Brighton Grammar and competed in many Heads of River but his best success came in the 1966 Australian Junior Eight Championship at Ballarat. At the end of 1966 a commentator from Deniliquin came to call the rowing races at Yarrawonga on Lake Mulwala, with no idea about any of the Melbourne crews. "I got up alongside him to give him some tips, and he said you better call a few races', so I did," Roger recalls. "The next year in 1967 I started commentating all out of Melbourne.

All because one day I took a chance on an opportunity; and what opportunity it was. Roger is well known for his rowing commentating and rowing journalism ---covering all major regattas in Victoria for over 50 years and is the ABC rowing commentator with "The Voice of Rowing" ---covering 43 Kings Cups and National Rowing Championships and 43 APS Head of The River Regattas in Victoria and has covered four Olympic Games rowing, four World Rowing Championships and the World Masters Rowing Championships as main commentator at Ballarat in 2012

In 2000 Roger was one of only 2000 Sports People awarded The Australian Sports Medal. For 8 years Roger has been The Patron of the Flying Doctor Rowathon over 82km in a day on The Murray and Darling Rivers at Wentworth in October Each Year.

Roger reminisced about various stars of rowing and kept the gathering enthralled with his love of the sport and what it has allowed him to do and friendships that he has been able to make. On the completion of his talk Roger was presented with a gift and given a vote of thanks by Lorraine Morgan AM a sportsperson in her own right.

As a reminder, now that COVID-19 restrictions are easing, we have arranged to have our Mid-Year Luncheon at Kingston Heath Golf Club on Thursday July 8 with Professor Graeme Samuel AC as our guest speaker. We would ask the members and friends take note of the date with further information to follow.

We were gladdened to have twenty of our Regional Group's area citizens, recognised and given honours on Australia Day. They consisted of 1 AO, 4 AM, and 15 OAM, really great and especially pleasing to see that five have already joined the Association.

Vale Michael Gudinski AM

Recently, we heard the very sad news of the passing of Michael Gudinski AM, at the age of 68.

Michael needs no introduction and was a leading figure in the Australian music industry over the last 40 years. He was responsible for the formation of Mushroom Records, which helped develop several generations of Australian music, including Skyhooks, Kylie Minogue and Split Enz, to name only a few.

Michael has been the recipient of many industry awards, including induction into the ARIA Hall of Fame, Melburnian of the Year and, in 2006 Member of the Order of Australia in the Queen's Birthday Honours for service to the entertainment industry through the promotion of Australian music recording artists, as an advocate for young people in the music industry, and to the community.

His list of achievements, both personal and business, just shows how much a respected and influential person he was.

But, it has been his commitment to assisting those in need that has defined him as an outstanding leader in our community. Events, including concerts for the bushfires and, more recently, an online production called the State of Music which was created to help Australian musicians during the COVID-19 lockdown. Michael was also behind Music from the Home Front concert for Anzac Day 2020.

He was literally a larger than life character and the father of the Australian music industry.

I had the pleasure of knowing and working with Michael over the last 14 years, with the AFL Grand Final entertainment. He was simply inspiring to work with and that transpired right throughout his team. He would always come over and say "This is going to be a great" and then move onto someone else who wanted to talk.

I like everyone else who knew him, will miss the experience of working with Michael.

Michael is survived by his wife Sue and two children, Kate and Matt.

A major exhibition of more than 100 masterworks of French Impressionism in partnership with the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston (MFA), an institution renowned world-wide for its rich holdings of Impressionist paintings.
