VALE Vilmos Milisits OAM (1948-2021)

SA Branch member and legendary Adelaide baker Vilmos 'Vili' Milisits OAM died in Sydney on 26 March following a lung transplant, aged 72.

Vili came to Adelaide as a refugee from Hungary in 1956, and ultimately he and his wife Rosemary came to run a business that has become a South Australian icon.

Vili and Rosemary were both awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in the Queen's Birthday Honours List of 2005, *"For service to the food industry, and to the community through support for a range of charitable organisations"*. The SA Branch Chairman, Tony Metcalf OAM, gave this message of condolence:

"Vili has supported the SA Branch with enthusiasm and contributions since 2005 when he and Rosemary were awarded their individual Medals of the Order of Australia".

On behalf of all members and friends of the South Australia Branch, the Chairman and Branch Committee members wish to extend our deepest condolences to Rosemary, Simon and Alison for their very sad and tragic loss.

"Vili will be remembered with deep affection".

The guest speaker at the February Fellowship luncheon meeting was Gillian Rogers OAM, who spoke about various aspects of her life and her community service. Gillian was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in the 1994 Australia Day Honours List, *"For service to youth with intellectual disabilities, particularly through the Get Together Club"*.

While she was a teacher, Gillian also taught at the Minda Home as a volunteer, and then at the Kensington Centre with senior students aged from 15 to 20 years of age.



Gillian said: "I started the Get Together Club through my awareness of students who lived at home with amazing families, but who had little interaction with their peers outside of school".

The club evolved into social activities, with monthly craft, cooking and disco events. Two netball teams were established, a turf cricket team, and an indoor soccer team, providing more opportunities for *"marvellous young people"*.

Gillian received the insignia of her OAM from Her Excellency the Governor Dame Roma Mitchell at Government House Adelaide in 1994 (pictured left).

Dame Roma Mitchell AC DBE CVO QC (1913-2000) was the 31st Governor of South Australia, from 6 February 1991 to 21 July 1996, serving through the terms of three Premiers.

SOUTH EAST REGIONAL GROUP Friday 26 February 2021

The South East Regional Group recently held its annual meeting and luncheon at the Mount Gambier Community RSL on 26 February. The SA Branch Chair Tony Metcalf OAM and Cheryl Metcalf, and Ken Coventry OAM JP (SA Branch Regional Groups Coordinator) and Di Coventry attended the event. A total of 39 members and guests were present.

The guest speaker was Mr Tony Hutchison AM, who gave a review of his life – "From Sheep to Space".

A long-time resident of Kingston SE, Tony was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia in the 2020 Queen's Birthday Honours List, *"For significant service to amateur radio, particularly to satellite and space communication"*.

Tony was recognised for his 20 year involvement with the South East Radio Group of ARISS (Amateur Radio in the South East of South Australia and Far West Victoria) and with NASA. To NASA personnel and astronauts, Tony is known as 'VK5ZAI'.

Tony has dedicated years of commitment to amateur radio space communication. In this time, he has done much to promote Amateur Radio to many young people who had their first experience with Amateur Radio during his many school ARISS contacts to the International Space Station.

A Minute's Silence was given to reflect on the many community contributions of Rowley Charles 'Charlie' Miller OAM (1924-2020). A biographical profile was included in the March newsletter.

The South East Regional Group has decided to meet in Mount Gambier biannually, and to meet on the alternate years at Naracoorte and Millicent respectively.

ZAHRA BAYANI: "Nothing in this world is impossible"

At the beginning of 2019, Zahra Bayani was a recipient of an Order of Australia Association Student Citizenship Awards 'Highly Commended' certificate. This award recognised her outstanding citizenship and leadership at Thebarton Senior College and in support of numerous community charities.

At the beginning of 2020, Zahra was announced as the recipient of the Australia Day Council of South Australia's 2020 Leadership in Languages and Culture Award. Her citation stated: "Zahra Bayani is passionate about motivating and empowering youth, which she hopes to inspire to follow their dreams and reach their full potential, by sharing her own life experiences . . . She is grateful for the opportunities and hopes to inspire other disadvantaged youth to integrate well into the Australian society and enrich this beautiful country".

Zahra is proficient in Dari, Hazaragi, Persian and English. She is a volunteer with organisations such as the Australian Red Cross, St John Ambulance, Rotary International, the Rotary Youth Leadership Award, the Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment and the Global Peace Rotaract Club. She also volunteers with the Australian Migration Resource Centre, and is an Ambassador for Australian Migration Museum.



And then in January this year, Zahra Bayani was announced as one of the City of Salisbury's 2021 Australia Day Citizen of the Year Award recipients. Each of the recipients has contributed greatly to the Salisbury community in many different ways.

Regarding the announcement, Zahra said, "I had the honour and privilege of accepting the Young Citizen of the Year Award from City of Salisbury. It certainly is a proud and humbling experience for me and my family".

She said: "To those reading this, dream big but be willing to work hard and smart to achieve them because nothing in this world is impossible if you put your heart and soul into it".

to celebrate and promote outstanding Australian citizenship All nominations are considered by an adjudication panel and those students judged worthy of recognition will receive a *Highly Commended or With Distinction* certificate signed by His Excellency the Governor and Patron of the S.A. Branch of the Association.

The ten students judged most worthy will each be invited to receive a special plaque at a reception to be hosted by His Excellency The Governor, usually at Government House.

At this ceremony, the 2021 Student Citizen of the Year will be announced and presented with a special trophy.

REVERENT REFLECTION

Alana, aged 15 and recently promoted to Cadet Corporal, reflected on why commemorating Anzac Day is important to her, drawing the connection from 1915 to events six decades later:

"The spirit of Anzac Day lives in the hearts and minds of all Australians, acknowledging the courage and sacrifice of those who contributed so much in shaping the identity of our proud nation. The soldiers known as the Anzacs and the pride they took in that name continues to this day. We not only remember but commemorate all Australians and New Zealanders, who served and died in all wars, all conflicts, and all peacekeeping operations".

"Between 1955 and 1975, my grandparents and great-grandparents lived through a lot of their childhood and teenage years in the Vietnam wars, serving and fighting for their country, for their rights, and for their people. Afterwards, we started a new peaceful life in our beautiful country, Australia".

"To me, Anzac Day is not just about loss. It is about endurance, duty, having courage, mateship, the love of a country and the self-worth and decency in the face of dreadful odds. It is a time for my family and I to honour those who served with great respect, honouring their sacrifices, throughout all wars across the nation".

REPLY FORM – SA Branch Port River Dolphin Explorer Cruise, Wednesday 12 May – a two-hour boat trip from Port Adelaide to the Dolphin Sanctuary and return, including a two-course lunch. The cost is \$32 per person.

The boat has two airconditioned decks, and a top sun deck that allows all-round viewing. Each deck has a full bar available for drinks, and all meals are freshly prepared and cooked on board and served to the table. A lift between decks and toilet facilities provides wheelchair access for passengers who need such facilities.

The Dolphin Sanctuary is located at the eastern end of the Port River: **the cruise leaves from the wharf at the end of Commercial Street**.

To comply with COVID regulations, members are required to sign in at 11.00 am, and the cruise will begin at 11.30 am.
