CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



Fellow ACT Branch Members,

It has been a busy couple of months since our last newsletter and more is in prospect for the rest of the year. In late March we postponed our morning tea with Dr Peter Pedersen AM as the date coincided with the centenary fly-past for the Royal Australian Air Force; we will reschedule Peter for October. But we were able to hold our morning tea in April with the Director of the National Arboretum and Stromlo Forest Park, Scott Saddler AM. This event was very well attended, and you can find a report later in the newsletter and on the website. Scott's slides – and those from the presentation after the AGM by Andrew Phelan AM – are available on request.

We have four events coming up – a breakfast for new recipients on 26 May; our 2021 Queen's Birthday Luncheon on 15 June; a morning tea with Ian Mansfield AM, CSC in

July; and our 2021 Australian Defence Force Oration with the Chief of Air Force on Monday 9 August. You can find details later in this newsletter and on the website.

The planning committee for the 2022 National Conference and AGM has been very busy and is close to confirming venues for the conference itself, the conference dinner and the farewell luncheon. More details on all that in coming months.

Members will recall that in March the Committee invited responses to a short survey on our event program. Sadly, we did not receive enough responses to draw authoritative data on members' views on the program – just 18 surveys were returned from our membership of about 550, although we also received emails from several members explaining that they are no longer able to attend events. In the absence of clear guidance from members, the Committee will continue to conduct the program pretty much as it stands.

The 2021 National AGM was held on 8 May via video link. The financial report and other matters were all passed. The attendance was disappointing, with only about 30 of our 8,000 members Australia-wide sitting in, while another 60 or so had submitted proxies. We certainly hope for a better result in Canberra next year.

Our Branch Nominated Director, Alan Morrison AM, is unavailable to provide a national report this month, but I can advise that the Board met on 16 April. It resolved to seek additional year of birth data for members to assist in actuarial calculations, and many of you will have received an email request to provide your birth year. The Board also conducted its annual review of the Association's strategic plan and identified several short-term goals for 2021.

So, as you can see, quite a lot has been going on. I will continue to keep you posted and I look forward to seeing you at our events in coming months.

MORNING TEA with SCOTT SADDLER AM



On Tuesday 27 April, 34 members enjoyed a morning tea with Branch member Scott Saddler AM as guest speaker. Scott is the Executive Branch Manager for the National Arboretum and Stromlo Forest Park. Scott talked about the Arboretum from inception in 2005 to today and gave insights into the management and future plans for the development of the Arboretum into a complete tourist destination. Scott expressed his appreciation for the valuable support the Friends of the Arboretum provide in helping with the maintenance of the 44000 trees in 100 forests over 250 hectares and for the sponsors that have provided facilities and gardens in the precinct. As a proud Wiradjuri man, Scott said how he valued the encouragement provided by his elders in his youth and has in turn provided mentoring to indigenous youth. The Arboretum has a proactive role in the celebration and inclusion of indigenous Australian people and their culture. MEET OUR MEMBERS

BRIAN O'KEEFFE AO



The involvement of Branch member Brian O'Keeffe AO in air traffic management over five decades has resulted in his becoming one of the most influential Australians in world aviation safety. Brian first applied his electronics engineering knowledge to radio installations, setting the groundwork for the design of the Instrument Landing System (ILS) which became the standard in Australia for many years. This allowed pilots to conduct an instrument approach to landing if they were unable to establish visual contact with the runway.

Brian was the co-developer of a high accuracy optical electrical tracking system which became part of the Microwave Landing System (MLS). In 1967 he presented a

paper to the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) to replace ILS with MLS. He led the Department of Transport MLS program to produce and test an MLS system (later known as INTERSCAN). This more accurate landing system was adopted in 1978 by ICAO as the world standard technology for assisted landing.

Brian was elected chairman of the ICAO committee that worked to have an integrated system of communication, navigation, surveillance, and air traffic management accepted at a world-wide ICAO meeting in 1991. He was subsequently elected First Vice-President of the ICAO General assembly in 1992.

He held several key strategic and operational roles in the Department of Transport including First Assistant Secretary Airways Operation Division and in 1988 was appointed General Manager Advanced Systems Development for the Civil Aviation Authority, a position he held until retirement in 1997.

In recognition of his international contribution, Brian received many awards including being inducted into the Hall of Fame at the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum in Washington DC in 1997 and in 2004, receiving the Edward Warner Award, ICAO's highest honour.

In 1992 Brian was appointed an Officer in the Order of Australia for service to civil aviation, particularly international civil aviation.

TRISH KELLER OAM

Trish Keller OAM is a former Chair of the ACT Branch of the OAA and currently a member of the 2022 OAA Conference committee. Trish was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in 2006 for service to the community, particularly through programs initiated at the Narrabundah Primary School, and to education. She retired after a distinguished career as an educator and primary school principal. Trish had been the principal of Giralang Primary School since 2007 and was the principal of Narrabundah Primary School from 2000 to 2006. During her time at Narrabundah Primary School, Trish set up the innovative Koori classroom, a place where

Another of Trish's Narrabundah projects was to get local businesses to provide food for students whose families were unable to give them breakfast. Trish has always believed in making the school an integral part of the community and has worked hard to achieve equity and excellence for vulnerable groups.

Trish also nurtured a caring and inclusive environment at Giralang primary. She developed the school's unique relationship with the Rats of Tobruk Association and the special opportunities that has created for the association and the school.

She was involved in establishing the school-based Student Citizenship Awards program which the Branch runs on annual basis to recognise those ACT students who show examples of good citizenship. She continues as a judge on the panel to select the students for the awards.

Recently Trish was re-elected the Chair of Friends of the National Arboretum, and at our recent morning tea, guest speaker, Executive Branch Manager of the Arboretum, Scott Saddler AM acknowledged the significant contribution she has made to the Arboretum.
