Investiture ceremonies will take place on Wednesday 1 and Thursday 2 September at Government House in Hobart.

The dinner provided an opportunity to thank Her Excellency for her dedication and service as Governor of Tasmania over the past six and a half years and to express appreciation to Mr Warner for his support and valuable contribution. Thank you to members who represented the Northern Region by attending this dinner at the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania in Hobart.

On 16 June 2021 former Judge of the Federal Circuit Court of Australia and 2021 Queen's Birthday honour recipient Barbara Baker was sworn in as Tasmania's 29th Governor. Her Excellency the Honourable Barbara Baker AC, Governor of Tasmania and Professor Don Chalmers AO have kindly accepted our invitation to a function in Launceston in November this year. 
Barry Maxwell Easther OAM

Barry was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in January 2019 for service to local government and to the community of the West Tamar.

Barry, Jan and their four children moved to the West Tamar from Launceston to live on a few acres where they and their children could enjoy an outdoor life perhaps with a few animals! That was 45 years ago and what a memorable time they had living in such a welcoming and friendly community.

All the children attended the schools at Exeter where Barry became involved in the Parents and Friends Associations. The Exeter High School was built during this time. Robin Gray who was running for election in 1982 said to Barry, 'One day, if we win

this election we will build you a new high school at Exeter.' He was successful at that election and in 1985 the new school was built. This was certainly a wonderful achievement for the West Tamar community, many of whom had been working very hard over a number of years for this to come to fruition.



He held the position of Warden 1990 – 1993 and Mayor (after the renaming of the position) in 1994. These council positions were the result of an election around the council table. When popular election for Mayor was introduced in 2000, he held that position successfully being elected every time until his retirement from council in October 2014.

Barry thoroughly enjoyed his involvement in local government; he was a member of the Local Government Association General Management Committee 2004 – 2014; Vice President 2006-2009 and President 2009- 2014. As President of the Association, he was a member of the Premier's Local Government Council and a Director of the Australian Local Government Association.

It was at 9.23pm on ANZAC Day 2006 that a large seismic event at the Beaconsfield Gold Mine resulted in a substantial rock fall. Seventeen workers were underground at the time, fourteen had escaped to safety and three of whom were unaccounted.





The disaster took the Beaconsfield community very much by surprise, many had experienced small seismic events but there was a general acceptance that this was just part and parcel of underground mining, never thinking that anything untoward would occur as a result of these occasional grumbles.

The story of the rescue was broadcast and televised worldwide and thankfully on 9th May 2006, 14 days after the incident two of the three miners unaccounted for were brought safely to the surface, but sadly one of their mates did not make it.

For Barry, as Mayor, it was quite a stressful time, but a time when he experienced the true values of that close knit and compassionate Beaconsfield community. The media exposure was incredible and even today people come up to Barry and say, I know you!

Barry retired from full time employment in July 1993 having spent 20 years involved in the export woodchip and sawmilling industry, initially on the accounting side of the business and later, he was responsible for the company's industrial relations and community relations. These were very interesting times, challenging but very rewarding!
