QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY LUNCHEON

Saturday 12 June 2021

The SA Branch held its annual Queen's Birthday Luncheon at the Arkaba Hotel on 12 June to celebrate the Queen's official birthday. It was an excellent and enjoyable occasion with well prepared food.

The occasional address was presented by Dr Duncan McKellar BMBS FRANZCP Cert OldAge Psych BMus(perf) (Hons) BA.

Dr McKellar, a psychiatrist specialising in the care of older people, is the Head of Unit, Older Persons' Mental Health Service at the Northern Adelaide Local Health Network. He is also Clinical Advisor for Older Persons Mental Health in the Office of the Chief Psychiatrist.



His appointment in May 2017 followed the release of the Oakden Report, to lead the implementation of the recommendations of the Report and a reform process in the Older Persons' Mental Health Service. He is committed to rethinking the way health organisations work in order to deliver compassionate relationship-centred care through inter-disciplinary teams where everyone matters, everyone contributes and everyone grows.

Duncan was a member of the Oakden Review panel with the Chief Psychiatrist leading to the "Oakden Report" which triggered further national investigations including the Australian Royal Commission into Aged Care. Duncan led the closure of the Oakden facility and chaired working groups for the development of new models of care.

The title of his address for the Queen's Birthday Luncheon was, "Us, the others and the Power of Stories", in which he introduced us to the term "othering".

This is a term used in the psychiatry profession to explain our tendency to align with particular groups based on one or more characteristics. The persons not in the group are seen as 'the others'.

John McKellar AM ED related: *"He illustrated this by referring to an episode I spent in hospital. He visited each day and on his visit would ask the same questions – Has the doctor been to see you today? Has he introduced himself? Has he asked permission to bring in students? This was an example where the doctors were the 'us' and the patient 'the others'. My responses to these questions indicated a gap between the 'us' and 'the others', and in the case of mental health it is essential to bridge such gaps".*

Duncan also told the story of a woman born in Europe who had been through the Nazi occupation followed by the Russian occupation. This woman had migrated to Australia where she raised a family. Later in life, she developed Dementia (Alzheimer's disease) and her family, concerned for her welfare, placed her in the state government's Aged Mental Health Care Service in Oakden.

Over time she lost had her ability to communicate in English and reverted to her native language. At the time of the decommissioning of the Oakden facility, the woman died – alone and in a bare room.

Duncan, as part of the decommissioning process, was later inspecting the rooms and on entering one room saw stained material and various boxes and cases belonging to the residents in care that needed to go with the patient in their transfer or with the family in other circumstances.

On opening one case Duncan saw, among other items, a ring and a wedding photo and realised that these belonged to this woman. These items had been part of the story of her life, and this woman had been denied the opportunity of holding her precious memories at the end of her life through having her personal items placed in a storeroom instead of in her room. It was an example of her carers being the 'us' and the woman one of 'the others'.

FELLOWSHIP LUNCHEON MEETING

Thursday 24 June 2021

For the June Fellowship meeting, Neil Andrew AO spoke on "Reform of water use in the Murray Darling Basin".

Neil Andrew has had a lifelong association with the irrigation industry, particularly irrigated horticulture and viticulture. From 1975 until 1983 he was a member of the South Australian Advisory Board of Agriculture (Chair in 1980-83). He was an Australian Nuffield Scholar to the UK in 1975, and had Local Government experience as a Councillor in the Waikerie District Council for 9 years.

Elected to the House of Representatives for the South Australian seat of Wakefield in 1983, he served as a Member of the Federal Parliament until 2004.

He was Speaker of the House of Representatives from 1988 until he retired from Parliament in 2004. He was then a member of the National Capital Authority (2004-08), and chaired a review of SA's Barley marketing legislation.

The Honourable Neil Andrew was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia on Australia Day 2008, *"For service to the Parliament of Australia through the advancement of parliamentary administration and reform, and to the community in the areas of agricultural research, development and education"*.

Neil is a Fellow of the Academy of Technological Sciences and Engineering, and a former Commissioner of the Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research, and was Chair of the Murray Darling Basin Authority from 2014 to 2019.

2020 STUDENT CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

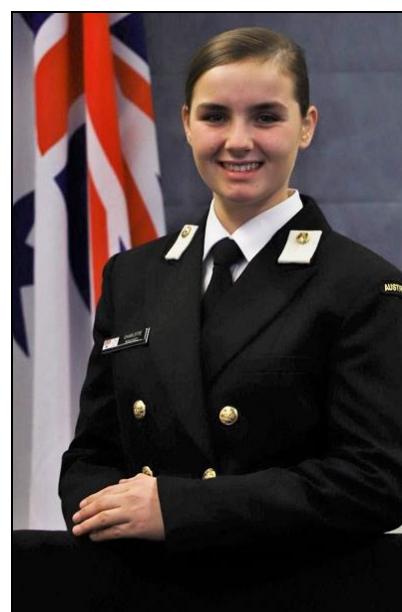
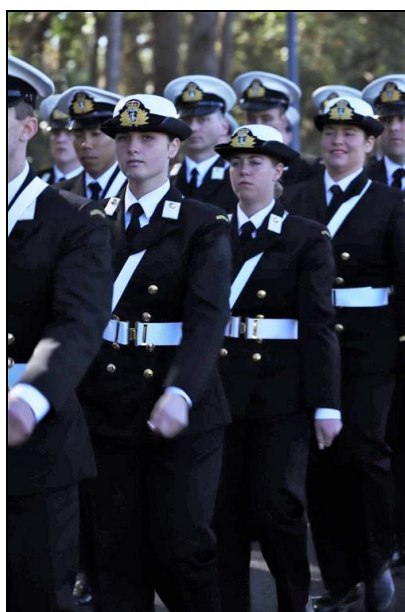
Our 2020 Student Citizen of the Year, Charlotte Mauviel from Temple Christian College (Mile End Campus), was officially announced in a presentation ceremony held on Saturday 23 January this year. Fortunately Charlotte and her parents were also able to stay on for our annual Australia Day Luncheon. But immediately after, Charlotte left Adelaide to begin her initial military training at HMAS *Creswell*, the Royal Australian Naval College.



We can now report that Charlotte has graduated from New Entry Officer Course 64 as a commissioned officer in the Royal Australian Navy. Her graduation ceremony included a Beat to Quarters and Ceremonial Sunset, perhaps the oldest and most significant of Naval ceremonies, derived from the age of sail.

Midshipman Mauviel will be based at HMAS *Cairns* for the remainder of the year for further familiarisation training. The primary responsibility of HMAS *Cairns* is to provide maintenance, logistic and administrative support for Cairns-based units including nine RAN vessels which have Cairns as their home port. Charlotte will commence her degree studies at the Australian Defence Force Academy in Canberra next year. ADELAIDE EISTEDDFOD

The SA Branch of the Order of Australia Association provides annual support for the Adelaide Eisteddfod School's Choirs section. The following report has been provided by Professor John McKellar AM ED:

On Thursday 17 June, I attended the Adelaide Eisteddfod Choral Competitions and presented First, Second and Third prizes in section C003. This section is for School years 8-12 small choirs of 10 to 25 voices. There were seven entries in the section and the standard was excellent, undoubtedly one of the best I have heard over the many years of the Association's support.

I believe that the SA Branch contribution contributes to encouraging music in Schools, particularly choral.

The winning school was Seymour College Chamber Singers.

Second place went to St Mary's College Senior Concert Choir, and third was Marryatville High School Swing Tones.

The other four groups were all awarded Honourable Mentions.

The adjudicator indicated that in her opinion the standard of presentation was excellent and her task the more difficult since the difference between the groups was only a few points.

READER FEEDBACK

In June we shared some feedback from former NT Magistrate Alasdair McGregor OAM regarding our earlier profile of Greg Gordon OAM who was recognised in 2000 for service to the pipe band movement.

Alasdair wrote to thank us for the profile of Greg, who was a piping acquaintance of his father, Daniel Law McGregor: *"It was nice to read about a piper and an organiser of pipers getting recognition"*.

From Comrie in Perthshire and war service in France as a piper and stretcher-bearer with the Seaforth Highlanders, Dan and his wife Bessie moved to Adelaide, joining the Caledonian Pipe Band in 1925.

Greg responded to Alasdair's remarks and the associated history: *"It is very interesting, indeed. I can remember going to Dan's house in Prospect for extra tuition in my early years"*.

This image from 1986 shows Greg in full uniform skirling on the Groyne at Glenelg, taken to promote the Australian Pipe Band Championships to be held at Thebarton Oval that year. Greg was President of the SA Pipe Band Association, and Chair of the organising committee. Greg recalls that on Easter Saturday, bands played in 40 degree heat and first aid for heat stress was frequent. Then, on Sunday, the temperature reached no higher than 20 degrees!

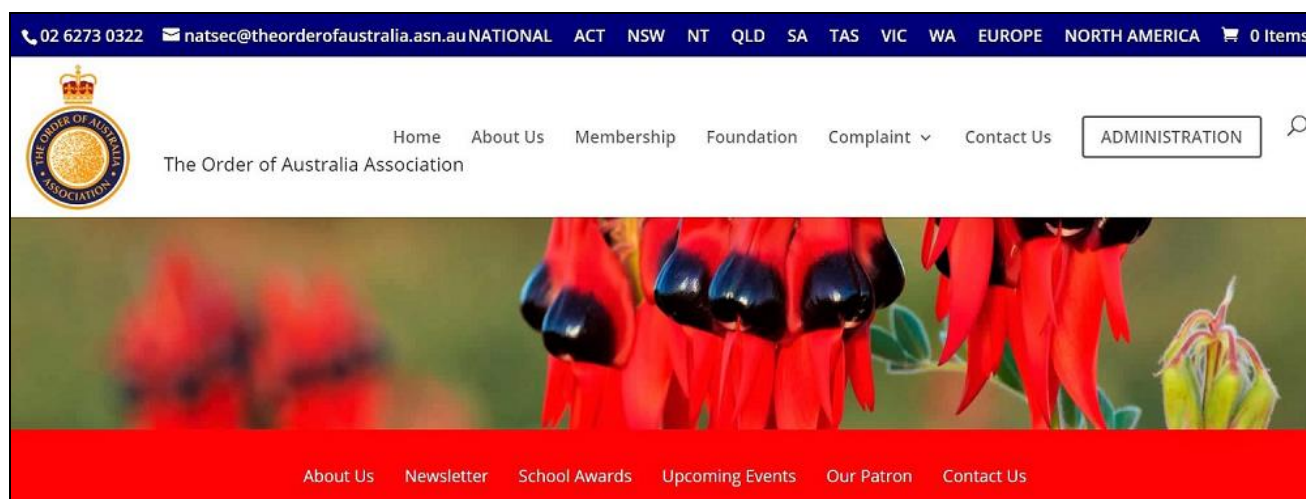
