
VALE Russell Ebert OAM (1949-2021)

With sadness we advise of the passing of South Australia Branch member Russell Ebert OAM on 5 November 2021, aged 72.

Russell Ebert was a four-time Magarey Medal winner who played a club-record 392 games for Port Adelaide, including three victorious SANFL premierships. He was recently elevated to Legend status in the South Australian Sport Hall of Fame.

Noted as a Respectful Relationships Advocate, he was named by the Australia Day Council of SA as the 2021 SA Local Hero (see right). At the time of granting his award, the Australia Day Council of SA observed:

"Today, Russell continues to give back to the club and the South Australian community through his leadership of the club's Power Community Ltd (PCL) youth programs. He is particularly passionate about PCL's Power to End Violence Against Women (PTEVAW) program, which he delivers to Year 10 students around the state".

John has been Deputy Director of Catholic Education in SA since January 2020.

LONG SERVICE MEDAL Duke of Edinburgh's International Award–Australia

Congratulations to SA Branch Committee member Paul Rosenzweig OAM JP who has been awarded the Long Service Medal of The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award – Australia.

This medal was created in 2015 by the National Board of The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award – Australia to acknowledge significant service to the Award in Australia.

The medal provides formal recognition for those individuals who have provided ten years' or more service to the Award in a voluntary and/or paid capacity. The first award presentation ceremony was conducted by the Governor-General in 2016.

At various times since 1984, Paul has been a School Award Coordinator, a Squadron Coordinator in the Air Force Cadets, an Award Leader and an Advocate, and he also provides support as a Friend of the Award. Paul's medal was due to be presented at Government House Adelaide in August but unfortunately the award ceremony had to be cancelled because of the COVID restrictions in place at that time.

Other South Australian recipients of the Medal include Alan Brown, Elizabeth Butterworth, Colin Curnow, Debra James, Thanh Thea Lam, Kathryn Oliphant and David Speirs.

The Medal and the first service clasp ('bar') have been awarded to Noel Mifsud, Robert Oliphant and Andrew Pope, denoting a total of 20 years' service.

Notable among the recipients of this medal is the late Vivienne Ashcroft OAM from NSW who was honoured for 40 years' service, notably as lead advocate to implement the Award Program in Australia for Girls.

Very early on in the Award's history, Vivienne was a key player in opening the Award up to women and those with a disability. You can read about Vivienne's contributions here:

The medal is not part of the Australian Honours System, and therefore is worn by the recipient on the right breast. The medal is accompanied by a lapel pin. Both feature the insignia of the Award in Australia – the Royal Cipher or monogram of the late Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, and stylised eucalyptus leaves.

Jubilee Medals A Brief History, Part 4

On 6 February 2022, the 70th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's accession to the throne will be celebrated throughout the Commonwealth.

Following long-established precedent, this milestone will be marked in Great Britain and parts of the Commonwealth through the awarding of a Jubilee Medal.



King George V Silver Jubilee Medal (1935)

After Queen Victoria's jubilees, the next Jubilee Medal to be awarded within the British Commonwealth was issued in 1935 to celebrate the 25th anniversary of King George V, the first monarch of the House of Windsor.

Prince George Frederick Ernest Albert acceded to the throne on 6 May 1910 as King George V, King-Emperor of the United Kingdom and its Dominions, and Emperor of India. King George and Queen Mary's coronation took place at Westminster Abbey on 22 June 1911, and the event was celebrated by the Festival of Empire in London.

This medal, designed by the Welsh sculptor Sir William Goscombe John (1860-1952), was awarded as a personal souvenir by King George V to commemorate his Silver Jubilee.

The medal was issued unnamed, and was despatched to recipients in a Royal Mint red cardboard box; the lid bears a large Tudor Crown of King George V flanked by the years '1910' and '1935'.



This is the King George V Silver Jubilee Medal awarded to Police Constable George Midgley of the Metropolitan Police for service in London with 'N' Division (Islington) on 6 May 1935 during the silver jubilee celebrations of King George V and Queen Mary.

George Arthur Midgley (1890-1955) from Royston in south Yorkshire joined the Metropolitan Police at New Scotland Yard in London on 1 August 1910, aged 20. He was on duty with 'Y' Division in June 1911 for the Coronation of King George V and Queen Mary, and received the George V Police Coronation Medal. This medal was struck at the Royal Mint in silver, 1.25 inches (32 mm) in diameter.

The obverse bears the conjoined crowned effigies of King George V and Queen Mary in their robes of state, facing left. The reverse bears the Royal Cipher 'GRI' (*Georgius Rex Imperator*) – 'George, King and Emperor (of India)'.

The suspension ribbon is 1.25 inches (32 mm) wide, in dark red with wide royal blue stripes at either edge, each bisected by a thin white stripe.

When this medal was awarded to a female recipient it was presented in a larger box, with the suspension ribbon fashioned in the form of a bow, with a brooch fitting.

This was the first commemorative that was not only awarded to those attending in England but also to community members throughout the Commonwealth considered to be deserving.

There were 85,235 medals awarded throughout the Commonwealth.

There were 6,500 medals awarded to Australian civilian and military personnel. The medal was also awarded to living Australian holders of the Victoria Cross and George Cross as a personal gift from the King.
