VALE: HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II

Australia has joined with the United Kingdom, the Commonwealth of Nations and indeed the whole world in deeply mourning the longest-serving, oldest and most revered monarch of modern times. The following statement was released by our National Chairman, Major-General Barry Nunn AO RFD ED (ret'd):

I am sure I reflect the sadness of all members of the Order of Australia Association in mourning the passing of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II on 8 September 2022.

Her Majesty has for all of us embodied the concept of service above self.

She has provided guidance and leadership both as Australia's Head of State and as Sovereign Head of the Order of Australia.

VALE: HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II

Memory on First Meeting Queen Elizabeth II

Greg Gordon OAM JP has observed that Queen Elizabeth II passed on his birthday on 8 September. He was moved to write down his memory of meeting Her Majesty in 1977.

During the Royal Visit of Queen Elizabeth II and Phillip Duke of Edinburgh to Australia in 1977, it was programmed for the Queen to open the Southern Plaza of the Adelaide Festival Centre on Tuesday 22 March.

The arrangement was that Queen Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh would walk from Government House and proceed down King William Road to the Festival Centre, a nominal distance of 250 metres, and spectators would line the route.

For the occasion, pipers of the Royal Caledonian Society of South Australia, Pipe Master Vern Raymond and Pipe Sergeant Greg Gordon were engaged to provide musical accompaniment. Amongst the assembling spectators, behind the barrier rope opposite the Festival Centre, was Christine Gordon with our daughters Catherine (aged 5) and Ailsa (2).

In order to see more up the street than the surrounding legs, Ailsa broke free and ducked out under the barrier rope, and came face to face with a big policeman, who said "Boo!". She returned quickly to the safety of Mum.

Precisely at 4 pm, the walk commenced, and the sound of bagpipes heralded the progress of the short walk. The destination was reached 5 minutes later, and the pipers ceased playing and acknowledged the Royal Party. Queen Elizabeth, always conscious of protocol, thanked the pipers.

In response, Pipe Master Raymond said words to the effect that it was a pleasure just as it had been to play as duty piper for her at the Palace in years gone by, as a Sergeant Piper in the Scots Guards. There were smiles all round as the pipers took their leave.

MALAYA & BORNEO VETERANS DAY 26 August 2022

Some of our members attended a Malaya & Borneo Veterans Day service of commemoration on 26 August 2022 hosted by the South Australia & Northern Territory Branch of the National Malaya & Borneo Veterans Association Australia Inc. The service honoured those Australians and members of Commonwealth forces who served during the Malayan Emergency (1948-1960) and the Indonesian Confrontation with Malaysia (1962-1966).

The ceremony was supported by Air Force Cadets from No 604 Squadron (Hampstead Barracks), supplemented with volunteers from No 601 Squadron (Keswick Barracks): the Catafalque Party used innocuous .303-inch SMLE rifles, representative of the era of the Malayan wars of the 1950s and 1960s.

Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia, and Mr Rod Bunten were the principal guests of honour, and placed a wreath together. The veterans and Air Force Cadets especially enjoyed the opportunity to meet and interact with Her Excellency and Mr Bunten after the ceremony.

During these two undeclared Malayan wars, 71 Australians lost their lives on operational service. It is significant to note that of these, 50 remain buried overseas – and none of them are buried in an actual war cemetery


In honouring their service and sacrifice, three official tributes were placed. Then followed particular spouses and family members honouring specific named Service members.

One among them was our Branch member Mrs Jenny Macintosh OAM, who placed a tribute in memory of her late husband, Wing-Commander Bob Macintosh AFC OAM, a Meteor fighter pilot in the Korean War, and a helicopter pilot with 9 Squadron from 1962 to 1965. In 1964 he was awarded a Queen's Commendation for Valuable Service in the Air for flood relief operations. In 1967 he was Mentioned in Dispatches for his distinguished service in Vietnam. And in 1969 he was awarded the Air Force Cross. Meanwhile, in 1965-66 he completed an operational tour in Malaysia flying the Iroquois on many sorties deploying Gurkhas and Australian soldiers into the Malayan jungles.

Bob was later a 'flying padre' and in more recent years was Chaplain to the Air Force Association in South Australia. In 2015, he was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in the Queen's Birthday Honours List for his service to the community, particularly through church and veterans' organisations.

VALE: Laurence John Lewis AM MID (1934-2022)

Veterans SA advised of the passing on 12 September of former Veterans' Advisory Council Chair and highly respected member of the veteran community, Brigadier Laurie Lewis AM (ret'd).

Brigadier Lewis had a significant military career spanning 32 years in the Australian Regular Army. He had an operational tour in Malaya and saw active service in South Vietnam as a company commander with the 9th Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment; he also served in Papua New Guinea, and was the Deputy Army Adviser at the Australian High Commission in London.

He generously gave back to the veteran community through his involvement with ex-Service organisations and associations, both as an active and engaged member and often as Patron.

Laurie Lewis was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia in the 2006 Queen's Birthday Honours List, *"For service to veterans as an administrator of aged care and health services, as an adviser to state and national ex-service welfare groups, and through support for charitable organisations"*.

STUDENT CITIZENSHIP AWARDS 2022

Monday 1 August was the closing date for nominations for the 2022 Student Citizenship Awards. During August and September, the members of the Assessment & Selection Panel reviewed the nominations and made selections, and drafted summary statements for each certificate. The certificates were printed, checked and prepared for signing, and trophies prepared.

Meanwhile Her Excellency the Governor, as SA Branch Patron, has agreed to host a Top 10 and Student Citizen of the Year Award Ceremony and Reception at Government House Adelaide on Monday 14 November.

Awards Convenor Mr Noel Hender OAM BEM reports that 49 nominations were received from 38 schools (11 schools each nominated two students). At a special meeting of the Assessment & Selection Panel, the Top 10 students and the Student Citizen of the Year were identified (and remain confidential).

While we await the announcement, we can reflect on the ongoing achievements of some of our past awardees.

Madeleine Moss, from Walford Anglican School for Girls, was one of our Top 10 recipients last year, receiving her award at Government House Adelaide on 29 November 2021. Madeleine was at that time noted as holding multiple leadership roles and being an outstanding member of the Walford School community.

Madeleine recently returned to Government House to attend a ceremony on Tuesday 30 August, in which she received the Gold Award certificate of the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award. The certificate was presented Her Excellency the Governor, who is Patron for South Australia of the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Australia.

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is an enriching program inviting young people aged 14 to 25 to participate in a number of challenging activities over a minimum period of time. Congratulations Madeleine!

Special service honours late NMBVAA branch chief

KUCHING: The South Australian branch of the National Malaya Borneo Veterans Association of Australia (NMBVAA) held a special service at the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park here yesterday, to pay tribute for former president Brian Selby (1945-2022).

Arranged by the Sarawak Tourism Federation Heritage Development Committee, the service involved a ceremony whereby a tree was planted in memory of Selby, who was the president of NMBVAA South Australia from 2002 to 2006, and again from 2010 until his passing at home in Adelaide on April 15 this year. He was 76.

"Brian Selby had visited Kuching in the past, and arranged major veterans' reunions and commemoration ceremonies in 2016 and 2019.

"The party will place tributes, including one from the widow, Mrs Christine Selby," said the branch in a statement.

Among those present yesterday were Honorary Consul for the Australian Consulate in Kuching Datuk Philip Ting, NMBVAA president Major Paul A Rosenzweig (Rtd) and vice president Don Cameron, as well as Sarawak Tourism Federation Heritage Development Committee chairman Fiona Marcus Raja.

TRIBUTES IN SARAWAK, MALAYSIA

At the beginning of September 2022, Paul Rosenzweig OAM (President of the SA & NT Branch of the National Malaya Borneo Veterans Association Australia) and Vice-President Don Cameron conducted a reconnaissance and liaison visit to Kuching in Sarawak.

The primary purpose of the visit was to make preparations for a Malaya & Borneo Veterans Day service of commemoration the Australian and New Zealand veteran groups plan to hold there in August 2023.

Throughout 1965 and 1966, Australian ground troops were assigned to West Brigade which was based in the First Division of Sarawak on the island of Borneo.

The Australians occupied a series of fortified rifle company patrol bases and defensive positions, responsible for defending their allocated areas of responsibility within Sarawak and on the Sarawak-Kalimantan border.

The Borneo Post (Sarawak, Malaysia), 10 September 2022

Eight Australians died on operational service in Sarawak, and three further soldiers died after being evacuated from Sarawak.

On 29 August 2016, a black granite memorial plaque was installed in the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park in Kuching by the SA & NT Branch NMBVAA, to honour all Australians who lost their lives on active service during the period of the Indonesian Confrontation with Malaysia. The then Branch President Brian Selby led this reunion visit to Sarawak in 2016, and another in 2019.

Among the various activities conducted during this year's reconnaissance and liaison visit, on Friday 9 September Paul and Don planted a Norfolk Island Pine in the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park in memory of the late Branch President Brian 'Snowy' Selby (1945-2022), who died on Good Friday this year.

Fiona Marcus Raja, Chair of the Sarawak Heritage Development Committee, Sarawak Tourism Federation, gave the introduction, and Paul delivered the Eulogy. Don recited the Ode of Remembrance, and Paul acknowledged the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of Australia and Head of the Commonwealth.

Paul and Don then planted the tree, assisted by Fiona and Datuk Dr Philip Ting AM PGBK, the Australian Honorary Consul to Sarawak (pictured above on the left).

Philip Ting was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (Honorary) on 1 July 2010, "For service to the Australian Government as the Honorary Consul of Australia – Kuching, in Sarawak, Malaysia".

He has now been the Honorary Consul of Australia for 33 years.

John received the Medal of the Order of Australia in 2021, "For service to the community of Port Adelaide".

Throughout August, John had his artworks displayed as the 'Journey to South Australia' exhibition presented by Genealogy SA as part of the South Australian Living Artists (SALA) Festival for 2022.

This special collection of paintings featured ships important to the early colonialisation of South Australia in the 19th and early 20th centuries. The exhibition was formally opened by His Worship Michael Hewitson AM, Mayor of the City of Unley on Saturday 6 August.

The exhibition was punctuated by a series of talks throughout the month to compliment these works.

Coronation Aledals A Brief History, Part 3

This year we marked the 70th anniversary of the day in 1952 when Princess Elizabeth, as heir presumptive, acceded to the throne as Queen Elizabeth II, the fourth monarch of the House of Windsor.

Queen Elizabeth became Head of the Commonwealth and Queen Regnant of seven independent Commonwealth countries (the UK, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Pakistan and Ceylon).

Medals have long been awarded by a sovereign as a personal souvenir at the time of their coronation or on the jubilee of their accession to the throne.

This tradition dates from the coronation of King Edward VI in 1547, when the first official medals to commemorate the coronation of a British sovereign were distributed. King William IV released such medals for his coronation in 1831, as also did Queen Victoria in 1838.

These early medals (also referred to as medallions, medallets or commemorative coins) were simple souvenirs, and were not intended for wear.

King Edward VII Coronation Medal (1902)

Upon Queen Victoria's death on the Isle of Wight on 22 January 1901, the Prince of Wales acceded to the throne as Edward VII, King of the United Kingdom and the British Dominions and Emperor of India.

A Coronation Medal was struck in silver and bronze to mark the coronation of King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra at Westminster Abbey on 9 August 1902.

The medal is oval in shape, surmounted by a Tudor Crown. The obverse bears a profile of King Edward VII and the Queen Consort Alexandra, crowned and facing left and surrounded by a wreath that forms the rim of the medal. The reverse shows the King's Royal Cypher above the date 26 June 1902.

The anomaly of the dates occurred because the coronation was planned for 26 June 1902 but, due to the King falling ill with an abdominal abscess, the ceremony was postponed while the monarch recovered from surgery. The ceremony was actually conducted at Westminster Abbey on 9 August 1902.

Since the coronation of William the Conqueror in 1066, all coronations of English and British monarchs have occurred in Westminster Abbey.
