Both students have each made impressive contributions to their respective schools and communities, as can be seen from their personal citations.



# 2022 Student Citizen of the Year Callum Barrott-Walsh Cardijn College

An excellent leader through several committees and roles, Callum has accomplished many significant achievements which have positively benefited the College and wider community. She was a representative in the South Australian Youth Parliament and was selected as Speaker of the House demonstrating wisdom and humility beyond her years.



### 'CELEBRATION OF AUSTRALIA DAY' Saturday 21 January 2023

Our Guest Speaker will be Mr Michael Weatherald OAM, known widely as 'Weathers'. Michael was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in the 2012 Queen's Birthday Honours List, "For service to the sports of cricket and Australian Rules football as a coach and administrator".


He will present a talk entitled, "Mentor of People, Sport Coach, the Meat Industry, and a Bali Bombing insight story".

Educated at Scotch College Adelaide, Mick Weatherald became a sports guru in SA. As an 'A' grade coach, his ability to know everyone's name in a club, with 300-odd players, has been noted as 'simply remarkable'.

Adelaide University Football Club Life Member (2001), Malcolm Ashwood, has said of Mick, "Weathers knew every player's name at the Blacks – through all grades, together with their strengths and weaknesses. He made a lot of young men feel really good about themselves in their developing years".

"His award is a just recognition of his commitment and dedication to sport in this state".

Outside of the sporting arena, Michael has been the Managing Director for some 50 years of Consolidated Provincial Meat Group Ltd.



### Coronation Medals

A Brief History, Part 5

This year we marked the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the day in 1952 when Princess Elizabeth, as heir presumptive, acceded to the throne as Queen Elizabeth II, the fourth monarch of the House of Windsor.

Queen Elizabeth became Head of the Commonwealth and Queen Regnant of seven independent Commonwealth countries (the UK, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Pakistan and Ceylon).

Medals have long been awarded by a sovereign as a personal souvenir at the time of their coronation or on the jubilee of their accession to the throne.

This tradition dates from the coronation of King Edward VI in 1547, when the first official medals to commemorate the coronation of a British sovereign were distributed. King William IV released such medals for his coronation in 1831, as also did Queen Victoria in 1838.

These early medals (also referred to as medallions, medallets or commemorative coins) were simple souvenirs, and were not intended for wear.

### **King Edward VII Police Coronation Medal (1902)**

The Prince of Wales acceded to the throne on 22 January 1901 as Edward VII, King of the United Kingdom and the British Dominions and Emperor of India – the first British monarch of the House of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha (his father's line).

An official medal was struck to mark the coronation of King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra on 9 August 1902, while a distinct medal was awarded in gold to Lord Mayors and Lord Provosts from across the United Kingdom, and in silver to Mayors and Provosts.

The Coronation ceremony made major demands on the Metropolitan Police, with 512 police pensioners being recalled for duty. Extra pay, leave and a bespoke Coronation Medal were granted to all serving officers.

This Police Coronation Medal was awarded in silver or bronze according to the rank of the recipient – there were 67 silver and 19,885 bronze medals awarded.

The medal was awarded to all serving officers of the Metropolitan Police and City of London Police, as well as firemen and members of ambulance units on duty in London during the Royal procession and coronation ceremony.



This is the King Edward VII Police Coronation Medal (obverse and reverse) awarded to PC565 Police Constable Henry Wells (1868-1922) of 'A' Division (Westminster) of the Metropolitan Police, Warrant Number 78135: such medals in bronze were awarded to members of the Metropolitan Police below the rank of Superintendent.
