Pierre Bonnard is one of the most beloved painters of the 20th century, celebrated for his use of colour to convey an exquisite sense of emotion. His close friend Henri Matisse declared that Bonnard was 'a great painter, for today and definitely also for the future'.

The Pierre Bonnard Exhibition features more than 100 works by the celebrated French artist, spanning the late nineteenth century and the first half of the twentieth century. Paintings, drawings, photographs, folding



screens and early cinema will bring modern France to life with startling beauty and vivid colour.

Boer War Day Commemoration Service

On Sunday May 28, 2023 a Boer War Day Commemoration Service was held at the Melbourne Shrine of Remembrance. This was to acknowledge the 121st Anniversary of the Signing of the Peace Treaty of Vereeniging in South Africa to end the Boer War.

The Boer War took place 1899 to 1902 and we honour the service of 23,000 Australians and the sacrifice of over 1,000 Australians who were killed in action. Six Australians were awarded the Victoria Cross, the highest award for bravery.

On this day each year a March is held from St Kilda Rd up to the forecourt of the Shrine where a wreath laying ceremony is held. The Master of Ceremonies is Lt. Colonel Neil Smith AM, a member of the Order of Australia Association.

Several members of the Order of Australia Association were among the distinguished guests and this year Ross Newton OAM laid a wreath on behalf of the Order of Australia Association. Ross's grandfather served in the Boer War as part of the 3rd New South Wales Imperial Bushmen Regiment.

The theme of this years' Service was 'They Served Again'. Approximately 25% of Boer War veterans served again in World War 1. These men were welcome as they had experience of being under fire and many were accepted into the ranks as officers. Ross's grandfather who enlisted at aged 19 for the Boer War then returned to fight at Gallipoli and on the Western Front.

These were incredibly brave men and it is imperative that the younger generation acknowledge them during these Commemoration Services, particularly those who gave their lives so that future generations would remain free to enjoy our wonderful country.

Governor's Oration - The Contributions of Governors' Spouses

The Governor of Victoria, the Honourable Linda Dessau AC CVO and Mr Anthony Howard AM KC, invited representatives of The Order of Australia Association Limited (Victoria Branch) to attend an Oration on the contributions of Governors' spouses, delivered by Her Excellency at Government House Victoria on Tuesday May 30, 2023.



Nearing the end of her eight-year term, the Governor highlighted that, although she is the first female in the role, the influence of many women has been felt at Government House, and throughout the wider Victorian community, across the last 170 years.

The Oration touched on some of the hardships they experienced in colonial times, the intense scrutiny they

endured and some of their finest initiatives.

Thursday July 13 at 5:30pm Janet McCalman AC, is Emeritus Redmond Barry Distinguished Professor at the University of Melbourne. She is the author of four award-winning books about Australian life: Struggletown, Journeyings, Sex and Suffering, and most recently Vandemonians: the repressed history of colonial Australia. Her subject in this webinar will start from the basis that Convicts and the First AIF have much in common: young people snatched by 'history' to undergo a traumatic experience. How much did penal servitude in Van Diemen's Land and service in World War 1 affect the lives and health of those who went through those ordeals? Or were there other factors, starting in childhood that determined how resilient they were and whether they could recover in later life? Can history help us to do better in the future?

Thursday September 14 at 5.30pm Dr Neil Roy AM was a consultant paediatrician at the Women's Hospital from 1975 to 2007, and a key contributor to the development of NETS, the Newborn Emergency Transport Service, designed originally to safely bring newborns needing specialist care to the Women's Hospital.

Thursday November 9 at 5:30pm Jenny Graves AC is a renowned Australian Geneticist, a Distinguished Professor within the La Trobe University's Institute for Molecular Science. Her wide research interests have included mapping the genome of Australian marsupials, and she is particularly well known for her theories of the origin and evolution of human sex chromosomes and sex determining genes. Her many awards include the Prime Minister's Prize for Science.

Vale Dr John Richards OAM

We are saddened by the passing of Life member Dr (Frederick) John Richards OAM. John, a former OAA NEGV committee member and resident of Yarrawonga had recently moved to Melbourne where he passed away.


John a former Yarrawonga Citizen of the Year is well known for his work in the Yarrawonga community.

John was a jackaroo, conscript, farmer, and newsagent. He made very significant contributions to community in northern Victoria and held a number of positions in local health and community organisations.

John was the inaugural president of the Yarrawonga District Health Service board of management and a member of the Rural and Regional Council of the Victorian Healthcare Association.

He was also instrumental in the establishment of the Moira Healthcare Alliance, a not-for-profit organisation

based in Yarrawonga that provides home and community care services in Moira Shire and the surrounding communities.



John made a significant donation to Latrobe University to establish a centre to lead research and innovation related to the aged care workforce and health delivery initiatives for aged care in rural communities. The centre, based at Latrobe in Wodonga, is named in his honour. He was also awarded a Doctor of Science (honoris causa) by Latrobe University.

Dr (Frederick) John Richards was an OAM recipient June 2007 for service to the community of the Moira Shire, particularly as a contributor to health sector development, and to the newsagency industry through the Victorian Authorised Newsagents Association.

John was a true gentleman and will be remembered well by those of us who knew him.

Sunday June 25 luncheon at Yarrawonga/Mulwala Golf Resort with speaker Tony Rinaudo AM Tony is an Australian agriculturist, who is widely known as the "forest maker." Having lived and worked in African countries for several decades, he has discovered and put into practice a solution to the extreme deforestation and desertification of the Sahel region. With a simple set of management practices, farmers can regenerate and protect existing local vegetation, which has helped to improve the livelihoods of millions.

Tony has pioneered a technique that involves growing up trees from existing root systems, which are often still intact and which he refers to as an "underground forest."

North East & Goulburn Valley Regional Group

By choosing the right plants and pruning and protecting them in a certain way, farmers can help them grow into trees. Changing attitudes has been key to Tony's successful work. He realised that if people had reduced the forest to a barren landscape, it would require people to restore it.

Tony's farmer-managed natural regeneration method has restored 50,000 km2 of land with over 200 million trees in Niger alone. It has the potential to restore currently degraded drylands in an area the size of India. What he has created is much more than an agricultural technique; he has inspired a farmer-led movement that is regreening land in the Sahel region and beyond.

on Wednesday May 17 during Volunteers Week held in Glen Eira's main Auditorium. The Young Citizen of the Year is Benji Orwin. Benji is an exceptional young person, who started a project "Socks for Support" when he was eight years old, and has now reached the age of thirteen having distributed 40, 000 pairs of socks to the needy in five years.

His ongoing project has distributed socks to residents in locked down towers during COVID, socks to the flood victims in the Dandenong Ranges, a shanty town in

South Africa and many more worthy organizations. He is also an advocate and motivator within his own generation.

This is the second year this Regional Group has awarded a Bursary to the current Young Citizen of the Year in the local suburban areas that we represent. We strongly support and want to actively encourage the young achievers.

Several members of our Regional Group enjoyed a visit to Black Rock House, a historic house in Ebden Street, Black Rock. Built in 1856 and 1858 for Victoria's first Auditor – General, Charles Hotson Ebden it was purchased by the former City of Sandringham in 1974.

It has been restored extensively to its former glory, and is now lovingly maintained by the Friends of Black Rock House, who work with Bayside City Council and conduct tours and public open day events.


