STUDENT CITIZENSHIP AWARDS: 2023 Medallion Initiative

This Branch presents Student Citizenship Awards annually to year 11 and/or 12 student who have been nominated by their schools to acknowledge the outstanding voluntary service and contributions given by the student for their school and/or local communities. Nominations are steadily coming in, and our Assessment and Selection Panel will soon be holding a review meeting to look at these.

Following the close of nominations on 31 July, the successful nominees will each receive a framed personalised certificate signed by the Governor of South Australia and Branch Patron, the Honourable Frances Adamson AC.

In addition, as a new initiative being trialled in 2023, each student will receive a special Student Citizenship Award medallion. Students selected in the Top 10 ('With Distinction') will receive their medallion mounted on an engraved wooden plaque which will be presented by the Governor during a reception at Government House later this year. The other successful nominees will each receive their certificate and cased medallion from a Branch member at a presentation, usually in front of parents and peers at their respective school or college.

This initiative of including a special medallion for 2023 has been made possible by a very generous donation from Mr Keith 'Chook' Fowler OAM, one of our newest members.

Keith Fowler OAM, aged 102, was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in this year's Australia Day Honours List. 'Chook' Fowler is a veteran of the Second Australian Imperial Force – he served with the 2/3rd Machine-Gun Battalion AIF (7th Australian Division) in North Africa, and then on Java with 'Blackforce' under Brigadier Arthur Blackburn VC from South Australia. From March 1942, Keith was a Prisoner-of-War, working on the notorious Burma-Thailand railway.

Keith's donation has been used to cover the costs of Student Citizenship Award medallions in 2023. In anticipation of the success of this 'medallion initiative', the SA Branch is actively seeking support and/or sponsorship from our general membership to enable us to extend the initiative beyond 2023. HIS MAJESTY KING CHARLES III

by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of his other Realms and Territories, King, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, and Sovereign of the Order of Australia

The official coronation of Charles III took place on 6 May at Westminster Abbey in London in keeping with a tradition dating back some 1,000 years. Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia and our Branch Patron, represented South Australia at the historic event.

The coronation was held eight months after the King's accession – upon the death of Queen Elizabeth II at Balmoral Castle in Aberdeenshire on 8 September 2022. This followed the tradition that a festival such as a coronation was inappropriate during the period of mourning that followed the death of the preceding sovereign.

During their term as sovereign, Edward VII, George V and George VI had used the Tudor Crown – which came to be known as the “King’s Crown”. Elizabeth II chose to use the St Edward’s Crown, which accordingly became known as the “Queen’s Crown”. King Charles III has chosen to again use the Tudor Crown to represent his reign.

Coronation Medals

A Brief History, Part 11

In May we celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III – the fifth monarch of the House of Windsor, King of Australia, and Sovereign of the Order of Australia.

On 8 September 2022, Prince Charles acceded to the throne with the title, “by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of his other Realms and Territories, King, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith”.

Medals have long been awarded by a sovereign as a personal souvenir at the time of their coronation or on the jubilee of their accession to the throne.

This tradition dates from the coronation of King Edward VI in 1547, when the first official medals to commemorate the coronation of a British sovereign were distributed. King William IV released such medals for his coronation in 1831, as also did Queen Victoria in 1838.

These early medals (also referred to as medallions, medallets or commemorative coins) were simple souvenirs, and were not intended for wear.

King Charles III Coronation Medal (2023)

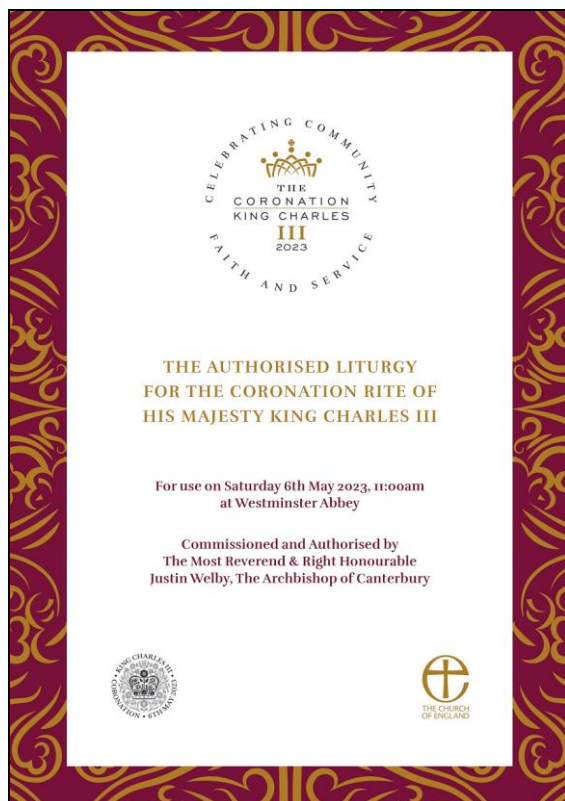
This medal was instituted for award in May 2023 as a personal souvenir to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III, the fifth monarch of the House of Windsor.

The coronation was held eight months after the King’s accession. This followed the tradition that a festival such as a coronation was inappropriate during the period of mourning that followed the death of the preceding sovereign.

The Coronation ceremony took place in the Abbey Church of St Peter in Westminster Abbey on Saturday 6 May 2023, conducted by the Most Reverend & Right Honourable Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury.

More than 400,000 people are expected to receive a Coronation Medal in recognition of their contribution to the King’s Coronation. Recipients will include police, ambulance workers, choristers and military personnel working at the Coronation, as well as emergency service workers, prison staff and members of the armed forces with more than five years of full service.

The medal will also be awarded to members of the Royal Family, staff of the Royal Household, and living holders of the Victoria Cross and George Cross.

The King Charles III Coronation Medal is struck in nickel silver, 32 mm in diameter and with a ring suspension. The medal is issued unnamed, and has been despatched to recipients in a red cardboard box.
