KOREAN WAR COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE Thursday 27 July 2023

Korean War veteran John Jarrett AM, Group Captain Robert Black AM RFD (ret'd), Lieutenant-Colonel Bill Denny AM BM (ret'd) and Major Paul Rosenzweig OAM (ret'd) were among the guests who attended a service of commemoration at the South Australian National War Memorial on North Terrace on Thursday 27 July.

This service acknowledged the 70th anniversary of the signing of the 'Korean Armistice Agreement' which brought fighting to an end in the Korean War. It is interesting to note that no peace treaty was ever signed, so the two Koreas are technically still at war.

The service was held at the Post-WW2 Operations Memorial, which commemorates Service personnel with an affiliation to SA who died in service or were killed-in-action in conflicts since the end of World War 2. The first wreath was placed by Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia.



Paul Rosenzweig OAM with Korean War veteran John Jarrett AM: John served overseas from 30 May 1953 until the Armistice on 27 July 1953, and then continued serving in South Korea until 14 August 1954.

John Jarrett was among the guests at our New Recipients' Reception on Monday 1 May. He was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia in this year's Australia Day 2023 Honours List, "For significant service to community health, and to veterans and their families".

John was Treasurer of the SA Branch of the Korea & South East Asian Forces Association (1994-07) and then served as President from 2013 to 2021.

He was Deputy National President 2008-12, and in 2013 joined a DVA Commemorative Mission to Korea.

VIETNAM VETERANS' COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE Friday 18 August 2023

A number of our members, military veterans and family members, attended a service of commemoration at the Vietnam War Memorial at Torrens Parade Ground.

This service was conducted by a group of veteran organisations, including RSL-SA, in partnership with the South Australian Vietnamese community.

The service acknowledged the 50th anniversary of the proclamation to end Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War. Some 60,000 Australians served in South Vietnam; more than 3,000 were wounded and 523 lost their lives. This commemoration honoured those who served and the families that support them.



HER LATE MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II Friday 8 September 2023

This month we mark the first anniversary of the passing of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II at Balmoral Castle in Aberdeenshire on 8 September 2022, aged 96, the first Sovereign of the Order of Australia.

We also mark the first anniversary of the accession on that date of Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, as King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of his other Realms and Territories and Head of the Commonwealth.

MALAYA & BORNEO VETERANS DAY SERVICE Friday 11 August 2023

As President of the SA/NT Branch of the National Malaya & Borneo Veterans Association Australia Inc, Major Paul Rosenzweig OAM (ret'd) hosted the 2023 Malaya & Borneo Veterans Day service of commemoration.

This service at the West Torrens War Memorial Gardens acknowledged the 57th anniversary of the signing of the Malaysia-Indonesia Peace Agreement or 'Jakarta Accord' at Istana Merdeka in Jakarta in Indonesia on 11 August 1966, which brought to a close the Indonesian Confrontation with Malaysia.

Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia and SA/NT Branch NMBVAA Patron, and Mr Rod Bunten were guests of honour and placed the first tribute.

Other Order of Australia recipients in attendance were Group Captain Robert Black AM RFD (ret'd), Lieutenant-Colonel Bill Denny AM BM (ret'd), Mrs Jenny Macintosh OAM and Lieutenant-Colonel John Spencer OAM RFD (ret'd).

During the Malayan Emergency (between 16 June 1948 and 31 July 1960), 39 Australians lost their lives on operational service, and a further six died in the period following the close of the campaign.

During the general period of Confrontation, in northern Borneo from 24 December 1962, on the Malay Peninsula from 17 August 1964, and in contiguous waters including the Strait of Malacca, 26 Australians died on operational service.

In addition, three died while serving with the Far East Strategic Reserve and two died at Ubon in northeastern Thailand.



VALE: General Sir Phillip Bennett AC KBE DSO KStJ (1928-2023)

General Sir Phillip Bennett passed away peacefully on Tuesday 1 August at Kyneton, Victoria.

Sir Phillip was a former President of the Order of Australia Association and one of the five Founders of the Order of Australia Association Foundation.

As a military officer, he served after World War 2 with the 3rd Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment in the British Commonwealth Occupation Force in Japan. From Japan, 3RAR deployed directly to Pusan for duty with the United Nations force during the Korean War, largely serving with the 1st Commonwealth Division. The battalion was awarded the US Distinguished Unit Citation (as it was then known) for 'extraordinary heroism and outstanding performance of combat duties in action against the armed enemy' near Kapyong on 23 and 24 April 1951. Bennett was wounded-in-action and Mentioned-in-Despatches.

He was Adjutant of the Pacific Islands Regiment, Officer Commanding 2 Commando Company, and in 1958 he served during the Malayan Emergency at Headquarters Far East Land Forces (HQ FARELF). He was Commanding Officer of 1RAR in South Vietnam. He was subsequently Commander 1 Division (1977-79), Chief of the General Staff (1982-84) and Chief of the Defence Force (1984-87).

As a Major-General, he was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia in the Military Division in the 1981 Queen's Birthday Honours List in recognition of his service to the Australian Army.

As a Lieutenant-General, he was appointed a Knight Commander of the Order of the British Empire in the Military Division on 31 December 1982.

As a General, he was promoted within the Order of Australia to Companion in the 1985 Queen's Birthday Honours List in recognition of his service to the Australian Defence Force, particularly as Chief of the Defence Force.

General Bennett was Governor of Tasmania from 1987 to 1995, and was made a Knight of the Order of St John on 21 January 1988.

FELLOWSHIP LUNCHEON MEETING Thursday 31 August 2023


Our guest speaker for the August Fellowship Luncheon Meeting was Mark Bourchier OAM, a former State President of Legacy. His topic was: "The Centenary of Legacy ANZAC Commemorative Tour, April 2023".

Mark received the Medal of the Order of Australia in the 2020 Australia Day Honours List, "For service to the community of South Australia".

Mark has had a substantial involvement with the Legacy Club of South Australia and Broken Hill since 2008, as a member of various committees, Chairman of the South Australian Badge Day Appeal since 2008, Board Chairman 2015-19 and President in 2016 and 2017. He is currently serving on the National Board of Legacy Australia and is chair of the National Marketing Group.

From 1981 to 1994 he was a member of the South Australian Country Fire Service.

In 2016 he was appointed a Knight in the Sovereign Hospitaller Order of St John of Jerusalem.

His involvement with Pulteney Grammar School has included roles as School Governor, as Foundation Director (since 2009) and Director Community Relations (since 2011). He was Secretary and Treasurer of Queen's College Old Boys Association in 2012, Committee Member of the Pulteney Old Scholars' Association since 1996 and President from 2014 until 2020.

Mark is a former President and Honorary Life Member of the Victoria League for Commonwealth Friendship, and has been Chairman of the Joint Commonwealth Societies in South Australia since 2015.

He was a Member of the Rotary Club of Burnside, and is a past President, and a Member of the Rotary Club of Adelaide East.

Since 2001, Mark has been a Consultant with Botanica Horticultural Consultants. He is a former committee member of the South Australian Association of Nurserymen, and was a Board Member of the Horticultural Media Association of South Australia (1993-97) and Chairman in 1996.

Mark lives with his wife Jo in the city, and his hobbies include military history and vintage and classic cars.

DAVID LINN OAM

Our guest speaker for the upcoming October Fellowship Luncheon Meeting will be Mr (Matthew) David Linn OAM on the topic, "Books for Lesotho – a Nation Building Project".

David had a diverse career following his graduation from the University of Adelaide with a degree in Civil Engineering. In his final 19 years of work, he and his wife Liz owned a small business in the service industry, which included work with several of our northern neighbouring countries.

David has been involved in quite a number of community organisations over the years, but there are two that particularly stand out.


David served on the Board of the Australian Refugee Association for 26 years, including 13 years as President.

His dedication resulted in David receiving two awards – Senior Volunteer in the Governor's Multicultural Awards 2014, and the Medal of the Order of Australia in the 2017 Australia Day Honours List, "For service to the community through refugee support organisations".

David and his wife Liz started Books for Lesotho Inc ('B4L') as a private initiative in 2007.

They worked to establish libraries in primary and secondary schools in Lesotho with the support of many local individuals and service groups. The organisation was incorporated in 2016. David is now Chairman of the Board of B4L.

David and Liz have travelled extensively in Australia and internationally, and have also supported families in Lesotho, South Africa and Namibia.

COROMANDEL VALLEY VISIT Saturday 30 September 2023

The SA Branch has arranged a social outing to visit famous Watchman House and Winns Bakehouse Museum in Coromandel Valley. Our host is Mr Trevor Conlon OAM (right). Trevor was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in the 2017 Australia Day Honours List, "For service to heritage preservation, and to the community of the Coromandel Valley".

Winns Bakehouse was built in 1878, with two ovens and the capacity to bake 220 loaves in each oven. The Coromandel Valley & Districts Branch of the National Trust SA was formed in 1970, and its members undertook to restore the then dilapidated Bakehouse which had closed 30 years previously. The museum was opened in 1971.

Watchman House, located at the same site, was built in about 1890 and is today part of the Winns Road Historic Precinct. It is named for the Watchman family who owned the house from 1943 until 2002. Restored in 2016-17 by the City of Onkaparinga, Watchman House is now leased to Coromandel Valley & Districts Branch, National Trust SA for use as a History Research and Community Facility.

STUDENT CITIZENSHIP AWARDS 2023

The Student Citizenship Awards program is conducted annually as the flagship program of the SA Branch.

We present Student Citizenship Awards to year 11 and/or 12 students who have been nominated by their schools to acknowledge the outstanding voluntary service and contributions given by the student for their school and/or local communities.

Following the close of nominations on 31 July, our Assessment and Selection Panel held a review meeting to consider the nominations, draft citations and prepare an order of merit.

This month the certificates will be printed, cross-checked and signed by the Chairman. They will then be passed to Government House for signature by Her Excellency the Governor, our Branch Patron.

Each successful nominee will receive a framed signed certificate and medallion.

Those nominees selected to be in the Top 10 ('With Distinction') will receive their medallion mounted on an engraved wooden plaque. They will be invited to Government House later this year to receive their award from Her Excellency the Governor.

At that reception, Her Excellency will announce the Student Citizen of the Year for 2023.

The other successful nominees will each receive their certificate and cased medallion from a Branch member at a presentation, usually in front of parents and peers at their respective school or college.


The Student Citizenship Awards program is separate from, but proudly presented in collaboration with, the Governor's Civics Awards for Schools.

NEW RECIPIENTS' RECEPTION Monday 9 October 2023

The SA Branch hosts two New Recipients' Receptions each year to welcome new Order of Australia recipients, to celebrate their achievements in a relaxed setting. Recipients from the 2023 King's Birthday Honours List will be welcomed at a reception to be held at Payneham Library in Felixstow (refer Reply Form attached for details).

Our Guest Speaker will be Associate Professor Tony Phillips AM. Tony came to Adelaide in 1982 as a member of a team developing the world's first disposable contact lens, and became Principal Optometrist in the Medical Contact Lens Unit at Flinders Medical Centre. He was an Optometrist in the Infant and Baby Contact Lens Unit at the Adelaide Women and Children's Hospital from 1994.

He has moved between academia, hospital work and private practice, and is author of more than 50 scientific papers. He is a Churchill Fellow (1992), and spent 18 years on the SA Churchill Fellows Committee: he was made a Life Member of the Churchill Fellows Association of Australia in 2010. He has also served as State and National President of the Cornea and Contact Lens Society of Australia, and is an Inaugural Fellow and Honorary Life Member. Professor Phillips was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia in the General Division in the 2021 Queen's Birthday Honours List, "For significant service to optometry, and to professional optical societies".

SOUTH AUSTRALIA BRANCH THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA ASSOCIATION

The Order of Australia was established by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of Australia, on the advice of the Australian Prime Minister, by Letters Patent dated 14 April 1975.

The Order was to be, "an Australian society of honour for the purpose of according recognition to Australian citizens and other persons for achievement or for meritorious service".

The Order of Australia is awarded for achievement and merit in service to Australia or humanity, and for outstanding contributions that benefit the community and ultimately, our country.

The second purpose of the Order of Australia is that it serves to define, encourage and reinforce community standards, national aspirations and ideals by acknowledging actions and achievement, and thereby identifying role models in the community.

The Order of Australia Association has the following purpose statement, as per the national Constitution approved on 17 December 2020:

"To celebrate and promote outstanding Australian citizenship"

The South Australia Branch of the Order of Australia Association was formed in 1980. Today, the SA Branch Objects and Purposes are as follows:

- 1. To provide opportunities to continue to contribute to the Australian community.
- 2. To foster love of, and pride in, Australian citizenship by example and encouragement.
- 3. To promote the Australian Honours System through awards to worthy recipients.

THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA

People from all sorts of backgrounds, of all ages, and who have done just about everything you can think of can be recognised through the Order of Australia.

The system relies on people like you to raise a nomination.

You need to include some examples of the individual's achievements and service, and details of relevant referees who can validate the individual's service.

You do not need to choose which level a person might be recognised at – this will be determined by the independent Council for the Order of Australia during their assessment phase.

Don't worry if you can't make the nomination too comprehensive – additional research and checking with independent referees is undertaken by the Council for each nomination.



Find out more

The Order of Australia is the most important and meaningful awards system in Australia.

Each year, the Governor-General approves and announces awards to people for their outstanding service and achievement.

 More information is available at: www.gg.gov.au

The system relies on nominations. People don't put their hand up to be recognised and they are not selected. They are nominated by peers and considered and recommended to the Governor-General by an independent Council.

A nomination can be made at any time.

 Nominations need to be made via the online portal: https://www.gg.gov.au/australian-honours-and-awards/nominate-someone-award

Users can log in, complete and submit nominations, and monitor the status of a nomination from submission to completion.

Nominations are then assessed by the independent Council for the Order of Australia – which includes members from each state and territory and community representatives.


