

FELLOWSHIP LUNCHEON MEETING Thursday 26 October 2023

Our guest speaker for the October Fellowship Luncheon Meeting was Mr David Linn OAM, assisted by his wife Liz, on the topic, "Books for Lesotho – a Nation Building Project". David was awarded the OAM, "For service to the community through refugee support organisations" (AD17).

David and his wife Liz started Books for Lesotho Inc ('B4L') as a private initiative in 2007, and the organisation was incorporated in 2016.

Peter Routley AM reports that their venture actually started in 2006 – during a visit to Lesotho, David and Liz met the librarian of the Transformation Resource Centre.

She explained that whilst English was used in the teaching of all subjects at schools, reading for pleasure was not customary in her country. Few schools in Lesotho had a library, so the B4L project springs from the TRC's plan to facilitate the establishment of school-libraries.

Fiction and reference-books are donated by local schools here, who no longer require them. Books also come from charity book-shops and private donors. These are then sorted by volunteers for varying age-groups and differing levels of reading competence, and packed for transit.

Between 2007 and 2023, almost 300,000 books have been sent to two hundred schools, various communities and local institutions in Lesotho.

Books for Lesotho, continued

Over time, B4L has also sent computers, wall-posters, various board-games, jigsaw-puzzles, pens, pencils, rulers, staplers, exercise-books and folders. Making use of all available space, issues of National Geographic, other magazines and even tennis-balls have been sent. Partners in Lesotho now include not only the Transformation Resource Centre, but also the Rotary Clubs of Mantsopa and Maloti. In round figures, there are 2,500 primary-schools and 250 high-schools as well as local libraries.

ADELAIDE SAILING CLUB TOUR Saturday 21 October 2023



David Russ from Port Noarlunga attended this recent visit and tour, where participants learnt the history of the Adelaide Sailing Club at West Beach – which was formed in 1998 through the union of Glenelg Sailing Club and Holdfast Bay Yacht Club. He provided this report on the event.

On a cool and windy spring Saturday morning, we took refuge in the Fuego by the Sea dining room at the club rooms. We met the Order of Australia Association group enjoying wide views across the marina and wind-swept gulf with a welcome drink and nibbles.

Our host Gillian Rogers OAM had arranged to guide us on a club historical review and story-telling in the 'Sunny South Room', which was packed with memorabilia, trophies and historical items all referenced in Gillian's presentation.

Around us, club members made preparations for the day's normal club sailing activities. They were unfortunately forced to cancel for the day due to the excessive windy conditions. It was noted that sailing involves a significant investment in time waiting for the wind to blow or wind to calm down.

Richard, pictured left at the New Recipients' Reception held on Tuesday 23 November 2021, received the OAM, *"For service to conservation and the environment"* (QB21).

He has had a long involvement with Scouts Australia, and has extensive experience in medicine (as a gastroenterologist and lecturer) and as a farmer (promoting scrub retention and sustainable grazing and landcare).

For his earlier service with the 1957 Australian National Antarctic Research Expeditions mission to Antarctica, on 5 January 1960 Richard received the Polar Medal in silver with the clasp 'Antarctica 1957'.

There were just 202 awards of this imperial Polar Medal in silver bearing the effigy of Queen Elizabeth II awarded to Australians for ANARE service, and only 28 '1957' clasps were ever awarded.



REMEMBRANCE DAY 2023

Various commemorative events were held to honour the fallen as we reflected on the 105th anniversary of the Armistice which brought World War 1 to an end.

As a volunteer Officer of Cadets, Branch Committee member Paul Rosenzweig OAM JP supported the Air Force Cadets of No 604 Squadron who participated in a Remembrance Day ceremony at Endeavour College in Mawson Lakes on Friday 10 November.

He will attend the Australian Defence Force Academy next year, with the intention of becoming a pilot in the Royal Australian Air Force.

Jubilee Medals A Brief History, Part 12

During 2021 and 2022, commemorating the 70th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth's accession to the throne, our newsletters carried a series of articles on British Commonwealth jubilee medals.

This article records another recipient of the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal, who had completed at least five years' service as at 6 February 2022.

Colour-Sergeant Tuljung Gurung MC

Colour-Sergeant Tuljung Gurung is the Mortar Sergeant in Support Company of the 1st Battalion, The Royal Gurkha Rifles.

1RGR is currently deployed as the British Army's resident fully acclimatised jungle specialist battalion with the British Forces Brunei garrison. Colour-Sergeant Gurung recently joined a small detachment from Brunei which supported the Malaya & Borneo Veterans Day service of commemoration held in Kuching on 28 August.

Afghanistan war veteran Colour-Sergeant Gurung is a recipient of both the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal (2012) and the Platinum Jubilee Medal (2022) – the fifth and sixth in his group of medals (pictured right).

His service in Afghanistan was under Operation 'Herrick 17' from October 2012 to April 2013, as a Rifleman in Mortar Platoon of Support (Medicina) Company, 1RGR.



Towards the close of the tour, Rifleman Gurung fought a singularly heroic action in which he ferociously fought off in hand-to-hand

combat insurgents who attacked his patrol base, for which he was awarded the Military Cross (MC) – a bravery decoration awarded for "an act or acts of exemplary gallantry during active operations against the enemy on land". Prior to 1993, it was exclusively awarded to junior officers and warrant officers.

Military Cross

On 22 March 2013, Gurung was on guard duty in a 3-metre high hesco bastion construction sangar, overlooking the entrance to Patrol Base Sparta, Lashkar Gah in Central Helmand. At 0345 am, under cover of a thick dust cloud (which rendered surveillance devices ineffective), two insurgents conducted a close-quarter attack on the front gate, directly on Gurung's sangar, in order to gain access.

Gurung was engaged with several bursts of extremely accurate small arms fire. Rounds struck the frame of the sangar as Gurung returned fire, and he was struck in the helmet by one round, which knocked him to the ground.

He regained his footing to resume firing, when a grenade bounced off the wooden frame of the sangar and landed next to him. *"Showing exceptional instinct and courage"*, he picked up the grenade and threw it out of the sangar. The grenade detonated, peppering the sangar with fragmentation, and Gurung was again knocked off his feet.

One insurgent then scaled his tower and tried to drag him out. Gurung instinctively drew his kukri and engaged the insurgent in hand-to-hand combat. In the struggle, Gurung grabbed the insurgent in a bid to prevent him from escaping and was pulled from the sangar, falling three metres to the ground.

Gurung aggressively and tenaciously continued to fight with his kukri to prevent access to the Patrol Base until the two insurgents turned and fled under the cover of darkness and low visibility. The battalion recorded:

Gurung's actions showed the highest levels of gallantry and courage. His speed of reaction and utter disregard for his own safety prevented two armed insurgents from gaining access to the Patrol Base.

His actions prevented loss of life and were exemplary for a private soldier.

In the face of the insurgent, Gurung's valour and decisive action was out of all proportion to that expected of such a junior rank and deserved recognition of the highest order.

King Charles III The Nuclear Test Medal

The first medal to bear the effigy of King Charles III has been created – to honour veterans of Britain's nuclear tests.

The Nuclear Test Medal will recognise the contribution made by veterans and civilian staff from across Australia, New Zealand, Fiji and Kiribati including scientists and local employees.

The medal was first announced by the British Prime Minister in November 2022, 70 years after the first British test of a nuclear weapon.

The medal recognises military, civilian and overseas staff and personnel who participated in the United Kingdom's Nuclear Test Programme during the period between 1952 and 1967.



The ribbon design of the Nuclear Test Medal comprises colours representative of the Pacific.
