OAA-ANU LECTURE – MONDAY 6 NOVEMBER 2023



Professor Kiaran Kirk AM, Dean ANU College of Science, will deliver this year's OAA-ANU lecture on *Humanity's ongoing battle with infectious disease* at the ANU at 6.00 pm on Monday 6 November 2023 at the Kambri Cultural Centre.

For most of humanity's history, infectious disease has been an expected cause of death. Microscopic pathogens

- viruses, bacteria, parasites - cause a range of diseases, many of them potentially fatal. The development of vaccines, and of antimicrobial drugs, has been a triumph of medical science in which the ANU has played a significant role. And yet vaccine-resistant and drug-resistant pathogens are continually emerging, necessitating the ongoing development of new vaccines, new drugs.

In his address Professor Kirk will reflect on the contribution ANU has made, and continues to make, to the development of measures to prevent and treat infectious diseases, including bacterial infection, viral diseases such as smallpox, and the parasitic disease, malaria.

Professor Kirk was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia in January 2023 for significant service to science education and research, and to professional organisations.

BRANCH NOMINATED DIRECTOR'S REPORT



The National Board Meeting was held via TEAMS on Friday 18 August 2023 and Noel Hender OAM, BEM was appointed as the Director for South Australia.

The Finance Report was again positive showing a current national surplus and a portfolio valuation of \$1,820,486.36 as of 30 June. The Variation Report showed that the actual income was more than budget and the expenses were less than budget.

Three applications for grants for Branch activities were considered, none of which were fully approved.

Applications from the SA Branch and NT Branch resulted in awards of partial grants of \$1000 and \$6500 respectively with a recommendation that they utilise their existing funds to fund their requests.

An application from the ACT branch to support the Student Awards was rejected and the reply to the Branch suggested that they also utilise their existing funds to fund their request.

The National Membership Director presented her Report, some of the key aspects of which were: -

- There has been a healthy flow of new recipients joining the Association,
- The nomination process has been updated,
- Magnetic Lapel Pins are being trialed,
- Dr. Caroline Hoffman AO has replaced Andrew Koo AM as Chair of the UK Branch.

The National Chairman advised that his comments that the Association would not comment on the Voice at the Geelong Conference were carefully considered and had been discussed with some members of the Board immediately prior to the forum. He also noted that the conference received a healthy surplus primarily due to the high level of sponsorship, and the Executive Committee discussed whether the national share of the surplus should go towards a Foundation Scholarship.

Planning for the Perth Conference in 2024 was progressing well.

The Conference Committee for the Sydney conference in 2025 had its first meeting on 29 July 2023.

The Audit and Risk Committee addressed several Associations Policies: -

- The G1 Policy Development Policy has been re-written to reflect the current practice and will be sent to Branches for review,
- More discussion was needed before deciding which social media platform to recommend to the Board for association use, and
- The National Secretary will prepare a Policy for consideration by the Committee to meet requirements from the 2023 Annual Information Statement, where all charities are required to report their related party transactions to the ACNC.

The Strategy Committee recommended, and the Board agreed that: -

- National payment be made for popular merchandise items to enable each Branch to have them on display at events for members to be able to view, and the Merchandise Committee develop a procedure for Branches to enable members to pre-order merchandise prior to an event,
- The National Treasurer will discuss with branch Treasurers the consideration of EFT payment options for members at events,
- The Strategic Plan 2023-2026 Version 7 be approved,
- The National Secretary will distribute the Plan to Branches, and the Strategy Committee will review the implementation and monitoring of the Plan,
- An article on the Strategic Plan will be included in the November copy of the Order, and
- An information session will be included in the Members Forum at the Perth Conference.

The Marketing Committee reported:

- Advertising in The Order has attracted no interest to date,
- A Welcome Kit for new members has been prepared,
- The NT Director has had success in having channels 7, 9and 10 show information about the OA nomination process,
- The three Geelong Conference YouTube videos were well received, and
- It has requested Branches to promote OAA merchandise,

The Board agreed that there should be a meeting 2 to 3 times a year between the Executive and the Branch Chairs, and that the first meeting be held in September. It also agreed that that an Assistant National Treasurer should be appointed as a non-Board Director.

The next Board meeting to be held by TEAMS on Friday 20 October 2023.

MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR JAMES INGRAM AO FAIIA

Branch Chair Andrew Phelan AM represented the Association at the memorial service for life member, James Ingram AO FAIIA. The service was held at the Australian National University on 9 August 2023.



Jim's career included appointments as Australian Ambassador to the Philippines, Australian High Commissioner to Canada, and inaugural head of the Australian Government's Aid Agency (1975-81) where, with Sir John Crawford he was instrumental in establishing the Australian Centre International Agriculture Research. highlight of his career was his 10-year (1982-1992) term as head of the United Nations' World Food Programme, which he reformed to enable it to become the world's largest humanitarian agency and in 2020 the programme was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. At the photo, shown speaking at the service is Cindy McCain, the newly

appointed Executive Director of the World Food Programme, with the Hon Gareth Evans AC KC looking on after giving his address. The Hon Dr Penelope Wensley AC, former Australian Ambassador to the UN and former Governor of Queensland is standing at the right.

Mr Ingram, who passed away in February at age 94, was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia in the 1984 Australia Day Honours for public service.

OAA-ANU LECTURE – MONDAY 7 NOVEMBER 2023



Professor Kiaran Kirk AM will deliver this year's keynote on *Humanity's ongoing battle with infectious disease* at the T2 lecture Theatre at the Kambri Cultural Centre, ANU on 7 November 2023.

Professor Kirk is Dean of ANU College of Science. After completing his PhD at the University of Sydney in 1988 he worked as a Research Fellow at the University of Oxford before returning to Australia in 1996 to head the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology in the ANU Faculty of Science. From 2009 to 2014 he was the Director of the newly-formed ANU Research School of Biology in the College of Science, and since 2014 he has served as College Dean.

Kiaran's research has focused primarily on the biology of the malaria parasite, and on antimalarial drugs. He was elected a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Health and Medical Sciences (FAHMS) in 2017 and appointed Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in the 2023 Australia Day Honours. In addition to his ANU role Kiaran is the Chair of the Australian Wine Research Institute in Adelaide, and Chairs the Board of Clonakilla Wines, a family-owned winery in the Canberra District.

Professor Kirk was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia in January 2023 for significant service to science education and research, and to professional organisations.
