


Deputy Chairman - Dr Michael John (Mick) Davis AM, ASM - FPA, LMFACP, FCHSM, LFAIES, MBA

Mick retired from QAS in 2013 after 50 years-service in operational and management roles and was appointed Volunteer Manager Qld Ambulance Heritage & History. In 1964, he began as an Honorary in Rockhampton QATB and was appointed to the permanent staff in 1969. He now has 60 years with Qld Ambulance.

Mick is President QAS Retired Officers' Assoc, Deputy Chairman/Treasurer of the KJ McPherson Education & Research Foundation, past director, Board of the Order of Australia Association, past Qld Branch Deputy Chairman/Treasurer and Past Chairman and currently Queensland Branch Deputy Chairman. He is a past Institute of Ambulance Officers (Aust) President and has served in most executive roles of the Institute, which became ACAP, Paramedics Australia and is now Australasian College of Paramedicine, and was Treasurer/Director until 2016, playing a key role in that organisation's evolutionary transitions. He served 15yrs as Director and Treasurer of the Health and Community Services Workforce Council and is currently a member of the Central Qld University Brisbane Campus Community Engagement Committee. Mick has served as Branch President and Director of Australasian College of Health Service Managers (ACHSM). He was appointed "Member" (AM) of the Order of Australia in June 2000 and awarded the Ambulance Service Medal (ASM) in 2012. In 2013. he was awarded the Surgeon-General John White Medal for Services to Health. In Dec 2016 he awarded the status of 'Doctor of the University' by the Chancellor of the Central Queensland University. In 2020 He was awarded the Centenary Medal by RQHS for services to Qld History. Mick started his work life as an apprentice Fitter in 1960 and soon became a member of the Qld Railway Ambulance Corps.

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Secretary - Robyn Porter OAM, BAppSci (Chem); GradDip (TechMgt); Cert IV Government (Procurement and Contracting).

Robyn has been a management consultant providing advice on strategic research management, large scale research funding and cooperative research arrangements, a research scientist in protein biochemistry/biotechnology, a patent examiner in

biotechnology, managed a competitive Commonwealth science granting program and administered some ACT Government programs which assist ACT residents in improving their homes to better suit the changing climate.

She was also actively involved in Professionals Australia, an association that works to achieve greater respect, recognition and reward for professionals in STEM, being both National Secretary and President of the Scientists Division. In 1967, following 6 years as a volunteer first aider for St. John Ambulance he commenced with the Ambulance Service in Melbourne. in 1988 he was appointed District Superintendent

Goulburn Valley Ambulance at Shepparton.

He has a vast experience in Major Incident Operations including the West Gate Bridge collapse, Hoddle Street and Queen Street shootings, multi fatality fires at Pentridge Jail, Ahmad factory and William Booth Home and the Violet Town Southern Aurora rail crash. He was for 10 years the City of Preston Civil Defence Controller (SES).

He has been active in many allied organisations including 59 years with St. John Ambulance rising to Commissioner, He was elevated to Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of St John of Jerusalem within the Order of St. John, and is an Honorary Fellow of Paramedics Australasia. He was admitted to the Australian Institute of Management as a Fellow, an Associate Fellow, Councillor, Queensland President and Life Member of the College of Health Service Executives, a Life Fellow of the Australian Institute of Emergency Services and was National Secretary of the Australian Resuscitation Council. He completed a Master of Business Administration (HRM) at the University of Southern Queensland and a Graduate Diploma in Health Services Management at Melbourne University (R.M.I.T.).


Merchandise Officer - Kelvin Brown OAM

Branch Nominated Director - Paula Penfold AM, BSc (UK), RE, RCM, CCHV(UK), Ethicist, AFCHSM, JP(Qual)

Paula has always worked in the Health Industry. First as a Registered Nurse/Registered Midwife both in Australia and the United Kingdom and later as a member of a research team doing bench top research into Neuromuscular Disease. The result of this research was two papers published back to back in the British Journal of Endocrinology

in approximately February/March 1992. Paula was instrumental in developing the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Queensland and also the National Body of Muscular Dystrophy.

In 1992 Paula saw a gap in Health Services for new Mothers and developed a business providing advice to new Mothers based in Pharmacies. The Clinics were held weekly for Healthy Infants and their siblings. All infants with a health challenge, needing medical or specialised care, were referred on to the appropriate area of health. These clinics were administered from Brisbane but grew to encompass the Eastern Seaboard of Australia through to South Australia. The clinics were staffed by suitably qualified Maternal and Child Health Midwives. Inservice was provided for Staff by Paula and other suitably trained Medical and Nursing Staff.

Paula was appointed as a member of the Ethics Committee for Children's Health and Research at the Royal Children's Hospital Brisbane in 1981 and remains on that committee to this day as the deputy Chair.

Paula retired from full time work in 2004. In 2006 she was invited to join the Quality Auditing Program for Health which was in it's infancy of development. She joined IHCA in 2006 and after completing a training program and registering with the National Body (RABQSA- now Exemplar Global) went on to Audit over 350 Services under Home and Community Care Standards, Community Common Care Standards, Queensland Disability Standards, Queensland Advocacy Standards, Human Service Quality Standards – Community, Human Services Quality Standards - Disability in Queensland, Third Party Verification Standards NSW, National Safety, Mental Health and Quality Health Service Standards and provided many levels of Consultation to a variety of Services. He is a Past President of the Association of Financial Advisers Queensland.
