OAA National Conference Report by Di North OAM

The National Conference was held at the Hyatt Regency Perth from the 16th to the 19th May.

It was great to see 22 people from NSW out of the 198 people who had registered to attend.

The conference was launched on the Thursday night at Government House with drinks and canapes hosted by the Western Australian Governor, Chris Dawson AC APM.

The conference commenced on Friday morning with the Oration from the Hon. Malcolm McCusker AC KC. During the day there were a number of interesting guest speakers.

Susan Boyd AO spoke about her life as a diplomat in the Australian Foreign Service.

Fiona Wood AO spoke about becoming one of Australia's top burns specialists.

Amber Merritt is a Paralympic basketball player and spoke about her life.

Dimitri Tsagari is a young, 20 year old Rotarian and spoke about his project which mentors high school students.

Dawn Mills is a domestic violence advocate.

Glenys McDonald AM found the HMAS Sydney off the coast of Western Australia after it as sunk in battle in 1941, during World War II, with the loss of every sailor on board. Glenys's discovery was against all odds. She was told over and over to forget it and leave it to the experts, that she was looking in the wrong place. She was only a woman with no nautical knowledge, but she not only found the Sydney but also the German ship HSK Kormoran that sank her. Another amazing discovery was that Glenys linked the body of the unknown soldier found in a grave on Christmas Island to be one of the sailors from HMAS Sydney. That was through DNA analysis. Can you imagine the relief of all the families of these sailors when their final resting place was discovered? Glenys told the most amazing, heart wrenching story.

Andrea Credo is from the Multicultural Women's Health Service.

Michelle Fyfe spoke about her work with homeless veterans.

Rahul Khubchandani was one of the first recipients of a Foundation Scholarship, who told us what the scholarship has meant to him.

Saturday morning was the AGM and Member's Forum where many interesting questions were raised including the length of time it takes for a nomination to be submitted and then to be approved. This currently may take up to four years. Rob Ayling from the Governor General's Department provided more information on this and explained that they were taking steps to improve this.

There was discussion about the benefits of OAA membership.

National Membership Director, Kathy Wooldridge OAM, gave a presentation on the Strategic Plan.

The Gala Dinner was held on the Saturday night. It was a wonderful evening with great companionship and conversation with good food and wine. During the evening six young people from around Australia were awarded Foundation Scholarships. They were all very well deserving recipients. Their parents accompanied them, and it was a joy to see how excited and proud their parents were.

Sunday morning started with an emotional wreath laying ceremony at the War Memorial in Kings Park. This was followed by a delicious farewell lunch in Frasers Restaurant also in Kings Park. There was a formal handover of the conference to A/Prof John Gullotta AM the NSW OAA Chair and Chair of the Sydney Conference Committee.

Those staying around a little longer were invited to Evensong at St George's Terrace Cathedral followed by supper supplied by church members.

There was a great deal of interest from conference attendees in the national conference which will be in Sydney from the 1st to 4th May 2025 (SYD25), particularly after the promotional video was shown on Friday morning. Six of the NSW Conference Committee heavily promoted SYD25. They all wore conference t-shirts and handed out coasters with a special QR code so people could register their interest in attending. Around 150 people have already indicated that they would like to come to SYD25 next year. The committee had a table set up with conference flyers and bookmarks with a QR code so people can register to attend when the registration becomes live. They had brochures from surrounding areas, such as the Illawarra region, to give people an idea of what they could do pre or post conference. There were chocolates donated by Stuart Alexander Imports.

It was a great display to generate enthusiasm for SYD25, which will mark the 50th anniversary of the Order of Australia Honours. It will also mark 45 years of the Order of Australia Association.
