THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA

The Order of Australia was established by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of Australia, on the advice of the Prime Minister of Australia, by Letters Patent dated 14 February 1975 to be "an Australian society of honour for the purpose of according recognition to Australian citizens and other persons for achievement or for meritorious service".

His Majesty King Charles III, King of Australia is the current Sovereign of the Order.



The Insignia of the Sovereign of the Order of Australia, as worn by Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, was depicted on these 33 cent postage stamps issued for the Queen's Birthday in 1985.

When the Order of Australia was originally created in 1975, it comprised just three levels, or grades: Companion (AC), Officer (AO) and Member (AM).

On 24 May 1976, the grade of Knight (AK) and Dame (AD), and also the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM), were created by Letters Patent. The level of Knight/Dame could be awarded only in the General Division, and no more than four knights and/or dames could be appointed each year.

Letters Patent signed on 3 March 1986 directed that no further awards were to be made at the level of Knight or Dame. Existing knights and dames continued to wear their insignia.

The level of Knight/Dame was re-introduced by Letters Patent on 19 March 2014, to recognise "*Extraordinary and pre-eminent achievement and merit of the highest degree in service to Australia or to humanity at large*". By Letters Patent dated 29 October 2015 however, the Knight/Dame level was again discontinued.



THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA Sovereign of the Order

On 14 March 1981, through a special amendment to the Constitution of the Order of Australia, the then Prince of Wales was appointed a Knight of the Order of Australia.

Prince Charles had some special connections to Australia, which included the following:

- 'Prince Charles Mountains' in the Australian Antarctic Territory were named in his honour (1956).

- Prince Charles attended the Timbertop campus of Geelong Grammar School for two terms (1966).

- He founded The Prince's Charities Australia, a non-profit organisation based in Melbourne, to provide a coordinating presence for his Australian and international charitable endeavours (now The King's Trust Australia).

- Apart from his time at Timbertop, Prince Charles visited Australia in 1967 (representing the Queen at the memorial service for Prime Minister Harold Holt), 1970, 1974, 1977 (as patron of the Queen's Australian Silver Jubilee Appeal), 1978 (the funeral of Sir Robert Menzies) and 1979.

- Prince Charles was appointed Colonel-in-Chief of the Royal Australian Armoured Corps (1977).

Since his appointment as a Knight of the Order of Australia in 1981, Prince Charles has continued his connections to Australia:

- Prince Charles made further visits to Australia in 1981, 1983, 1985, 1988 (for Australia's Bicentenary celebrations), 1994, 2005, 2015 (official tour of Australia) and 2018.

- Prince Charles visited Turkey to attend commemorations including the Dawn Service at Anzac Cove marking the centenary of the Gallipoli landings (2015).

- Prince Charles attended an Anzac Day service at the Australian National Memorial in Villers-Bretonneux in France (2018).

- Prince Charles opened the Gold Coast Commonwealth Games (2018). As heir apparent, the Prince of Wales (Charles Philip Arthur George) acceded to the throne of the United Kingdom and fourteen other Commonwealth realms on 8 September 2022.

At this time King Charles III, King of Australia, became Sovereign of the Order of Australia.

The insignia of The Sovereign of the Order of Australia is defined as a Badge of the same material, fashion and size as the Breast Badge of a Knight or Dame of the Order but with such alterations as distinguish the Royal dignity.

A new Royal Portrait has been released ahead of the Royal Visit by King Charles III and Queen Camilla to Australia in October, in which the King is wearing the insignia of Sovereign of the Order of Australia.

THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA

One of the major events for 2025 that the Branch Committee is planning for is the 50-year anniversary of the institution of the Order of Australia.

The Order was created by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of Australia, on the advice of the Prime Minister of Australia, by Letters Patent given under the Great Seal of Australia at St James's Court on 14 February 1975.

Notification was published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette*, No S28 dated 17 February 1975.

The guest speaker at our June luncheon was Wendy Chapman AM, who was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia, "In recognition of service to the community and local government" (QB86).

Peter Routley AM provided the following report on the day:

Our most recent Fellowship Luncheon was held as usual at the Naval, Military and Air Force Club. It was a very congenial occasion and well-attended. With becoming modesty, our guest speaker entitled her speech: "I'm just a simple country girl".

A country girl, certainly, because she was born at Bordertown, but 'simple' – whilst revealing an innate modesty does tend to minimise Wendy's considerable achievements in serving her community.

Wendy's AM was announced in the Queen's Birthday Honours in 1986. It was a fitting reward for many years of devotion to her fellow citizens. The citation mentions her 'Spirit and courage to open doors'. Most notably, she was a member of the Adelaide City Council from 1977 – as a Councillor and Alderman – until serving as the sixty-eighth Lord Mayor of the City of Adelaide in 1983-85.

Like many of our Association members, Wendy found time to bring benefits to her community whilst raising a family and living a busy private life. The members and guests who attended this luncheon were deeply impressed by the length and breadth of Wendy's service to others.

ORDER OF ST JOHN Thursday 27 June 2024

An investiture ceremony was held recently at Government House, hosted by Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia, in her capacity as Deputy Prior of the Order of St John. Among the recipients, Branch member Mr Ross Parkinson OAM MStJ was promoted within the Order of St John to the grade of Officer (OStJ).

Ross began his service as an Ambulance Officer in Bordertown (1975-83) and as a Regional Training Officer (1980-83). He was Superintendent in Millicent (1983-86), Senior Branch Superintendent in Mount Gambier (1986-88), Corps Superintendent, South East Corps (1988-90) and Regional Superintendent, South East Region (1988 – 96). He then held appointments as Corps Region Officer (1996-00) and Regional Staff Officer (from 2009).

He received the Service Medal of the Order of St John in 1986, and has received subsequent Service Bars.

In 1987, Ross was admitted to the Order of St John at the grade of Serving Brother (SBStJ). He received the insignia from His Excellency the Governor of South Australia, and Deputy Prior of the Order of St John, Lieutenant-General Sir Donald Dunstan AC KBE CB KStJ in an investiture at Government House Adelaide on 20 May 1988. In 2008, this level (Grade V of the Order) was re-designated Member of the Order of St John (MStJ).

On 9 March 1991, Regional Superintendent Ross Parkinson received the National Medal for 15 years' long service with the South Australian State Emergency Service, followed by the first Bar in 2000. He was an SES Officer with the Bordertown Unit (1975-83) and Millicent Unit (1983-86), and then Deputy Controller, South East Operations and Support Unit in Mount Gambier (1986-09). He served as a member of the South East Zone Emergency Coordinating Committee from 1986 to 2009.

Ross was the City of Mount Gambier's Citizen of the Year in 2014, and was awarded the OAM, "For service to the community through a range of organisations" (QB16).

These organisations have included Lions Australia over many years, and as President of the Lions Club of Mount Gambier in 2012-13; the Mount Gambier Branch of Riding for the Disabled; Australian Red Cross (Mount Gambier Branch) and Mount Gambier Lakes Rotary Club.

MEDAL NEWS

As soon as your award has been promulgated in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* or published in the Honours List, you are permitted to use the applicable postnominals. From this time, you may arrange a replica medal for wear if you wish, and also a lapel badge.

Some military and emergency service personnel typically retain their original medals in their cases to keep them secure, and have a set of replica medals made for everyday wear. This is acceptable, and from the moment your award is gazetted/announced you can have a replica of the new award mounted with your existing awards.

There are many suppliers of replica medals, and many offering their services to mount them.

You can have your full-size medals swing-mounted, where they are simply suspended from a brooch bar. Alternately, they can be court-mounted, where they are affixed to a backing board of matching ribbons. A small group of medals will be mounted in either fashion side-by-side. For larger groups however, the medals and ribbons will be partially overlapped.

If you choose to have your medals court-mounted, it is recommended that you use a service that secures the medals using thread, and not adhesive or double-sided tape as this will damage the medal.
