THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA


There are specific requirements which apply to the presentation of insignia of the Order of Australia.

These requirements are detailed in the 'Investiture Ordinance' issued by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, under section 30 of the Constitution of the Order of Australia.

When a person is appointed to the Order, or is awarded the Medal of the Order, it is necessary and appropriate that they are formally invested with the insignia of the Order.

This investiture, first and foremost, may be conducted by the sovereign, acknowledging the role of the Crown as the traditional font of honour.

His Majesty King Charles III may conduct investitures as Sovereign of the Order of Australia – recognising his position as King of Australia.

This is a program for an Investiture held at Buckingham Palace on 12 December 2001 in which the insignia of the Order of Australia was presented by Her Majesty The Queen to Miss Penelope Thwaites AM, a concert pianist and composer, recording artist and editor, born in the United Kingdom of Australian parents.

Miss Thwaites was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia, "for service to music through the performance and promotion of Australian compositions in the United Kingdom and internationally".

At that time, the Queen was hosting 22 investitures per year – one at the Palace of Holyroodhouse in Edinburgh, one at Cardiff Castle and the remainder at Buckingham Palace. Up to 150 recipients in total attended each investiture.

THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA Investitures

In a practical sense though, it is not feasible for the Sovereign to conduct all investitures, so the ceremony may be conducted by the Chancellor of the Order, which for the Order of Australia is the Governor-General.

An investiture may also be conducted by any such other person as the Sovereign or the Chancellor may authorise. This authorisation is specifically given by a Warrant under the Seal of the Order.

A Warrant to Conduct is an authorisation issued by the Governor-General (Chancellor of the Order) for a person other than the Sovereign or the Chancellor to conduct an investiture. This would typically be a State Governor or Administrator of a Territory. For a person residing overseas, the investiture may be conducted by an Australian Ambassador or High Commissioner.

This Investiture Ordinance applies to appointments and awards within the General and Military divisions, and Honorary awards and appointments.



The Australian Honours System

We all know that most 'quiet achievers' do their good deeds on a voluntary basis, without seeking notoriety or reward. The work of those who elude public attention and avoid the limelight is often most noticed by members of the community. For that reason, anyone can make a nomination for an award in the Australian Honours System.

KOREAN WAR COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE Saturday 27 July 2024

Korean War veteran John Jarrett AM was a very special guest at a service of commemoration held at the Post-WW2 Operations Memorial on North Terrace, which commemorates Service personnel with an affiliation to South Australia who died in service or were killed-in-action in conflicts since the end of World War 2.

This service acknowledged the 71st anniversary of the signing of the 'Korean Armistice Agreement' on 27 July 1953, which brought fighting to an end in the Korean War. The aim of this agreement was to, "ensure a complete cessation of hostilities and of all acts of armed force in Korea until a final peaceful settlement is achieved".

John was appointed a Member of the Order, "For significant service to community health, and to veterans and their families" (AD23).

John was assigned to the Royal Australian Army Ordnance Corps (RAAOC), and served in Korea from 30 May 1953 until the Armistice on 27 July 1953, and continued serving through to 29 August 1953.

He served with the Australian Ancillary Unit Korea from 30 November 1953 to 26 June 1954, and again from 4 July to 14 August 1954, seeing a total of 343 days' overseas service.

John was Treasurer of the SA Branch of the Korea & South East Asian Forces Association (1994-07) and then served as President from 2013 to 2021.

He was Deputy National President in 2008-12, and then in 2013 he joined a DVA Commemorative Mission to Korea.

Mrs Jenny Macintosh OAM honoured the service of her late husband Group Captain Bob MacIntosh AFC OAM, who served in the Korea War as a Meteor jet fighter pilot with No 77 (Fighter) Squadron, Royal Australian Air Force, from 20 May to 26 November 1953.

Bob was awarded the OAM in 2015, "For service to the community, particularly through church and veterans' organisations".

Jenny had earlier received the OAM in 2011: *"For service to* the community, particularly through the Embroiderers' Guild of South Australia, and to the Guiding movement".

VIETNAM VETERANS COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE Sunday 18 August 2024

Among some 200 military veterans, friends and members of the Vietnamese community, there were a number of Order of Australia recipients in attendance at the Vietnam Veterans Commemorative Service held at the Vietnam War Memorial at Torrens Parade Ground on Sunday 18 August 2024.

This commemoration honoured the service of all Australian, New Zealand and Republic of Vietnam Service personnel who fought in the Vietnam War, and particularly the 523 Australians, 37 New Zealanders and as many as 300,000 Service personnel from the Republic of Vietnam who lost their lives during the Vietnam War.



Among the attendees was Mr Michael Nguyen from The Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Association of SA, who received the OAM, "For service to the Vietnamese community in South Australia" (QB16).



Jenny Macintosh OAM honoured the service of her late husband Group Captain Bob MacIntosh AFC OAM, who was Mentioned-in-Despatches for bravery as a helicopter pilot in South Vietnam in 1966-67.



The first floral tribute was placed by Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia, and Mr Rod Bunten.

The Commemorative Address was delivered by the Honourable Rear Admiral Kevin Scarce AC AO(Mil) CSC RANR, who had served during the Vietnam War on the troop transport HMAS Sydney.



The Vietnamese-Australian author and academic Dr My Van Tran AM assisted members of The Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Association of SA in lighting the incense during the ceremony. Dr Tran was first a recipient of the OAM in 1986, *"For Service to Asian-Australian Relations"* in the Northern Territory (AD86).



In 2002, Dr Tran was promoted in the Order to Member, "For service to the Vietnamese community, and to the promotion of multiculturalism and Asian studies" (QB02), again for her work in the Northern Territory.

The 2024 Vietnam Veterans Commemorative Service in Adelaide provided a special opportunity for a reunion. Dr Tran had provided Paul Rosenzweig with her biography to include in his 1996 book, For Service. Awards of the Order of Australia for service to the Northern Territory 1975-1995, which was published by the Historical Society of the Northern Territory.

MALAYA AND BORNEO VETERANS DAY Friday 30 August 2024

Among the military veterans and friends, there were a number of Order of Australia recipients in attendance at the Malaya and Borneo Veterans Day Service of Commemoration held in the West Torrens War Memorial Gardens. Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia, and Mr Rod Bunten were the guests of honour and placed the first tribute.

The focus was kept on a select group of family members honouring specific named personnel who served or lost their lives in the Malayan wars.



NEW RECIPIENTS' RECEPTION Mr David Seaton OAM

The guest speaker for our New Recipients' Reception at Payneham Library on Monday 16 September is Mr David Seaton OAM, on the topic: "63 years a Chartered Accountant and other things". David was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia, "For service to the community through roles with medical education, health administration and charitable organisations, and as Honorary Consul for Sweden in South Australia" (AD09).



David has been a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants (Australia and New Zealand) for over 60 years. Besides his professional career as a chartered accountant, he has held board positions with Hilcrest Hospital, St Andrew's Hospital and All Souls' Anglican Church Endowment Trust (36 years), and has been Chairman and committee member for many professional bodies.

His other interests are reflected in his appointments as Secretary of the Australian Piper Aircraft Society (as an owner/pilot of a Piper Arrow) and Rear Commodore and Treasurer of the Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron (and skipper of 'Niambri' in the 1994/95 Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race).

He is an officer with the Military and Hospitaller Order of St Lazarus of Jerusalem, and for ten years was a Foundation Board Member.

David has served as the Honorary Consul for Sweden in South Australia from 1986 until 2009, for which he was appointed Commander First Class in the *Kungliga Nordstjärneorden* – the Royal Order of the Polar Star (KNO). This is a Swedish order of chivalry created by King Frederick I on 23 February 1748, to reward Swedish and foreign merit and devotion to duty. Between 1975 and 2023, the Order was only awarded to members of the royal family and foreigners, notably foreign office holders. The Order is also known as sometimes translated as the 'Royal Order of the North Star'. Its motto is *Nescit Occasum*, a Latin phrase meaning 'It knows no decline'. This identifies that Sweden is as constant as a never-setting star.




FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM 2024

Norman Donald Paterson OAM (1933-2024)

Regional Groups Coordinator Ken Coventry OAM JP has advised of the passing of Norman Donald Paterson OAM on 6 July, at the age of 91.

The patriarch of Paterson Bulk Transport, Norm has been described as a stalwart of the trucking industry and the Country Fire Service in the Murraylands, and was dubbed 'The Mayor of Cooke Plains'.

Fire-Fighter Norman Donald Paterson received the National Medal and the first clasp on 7 August 1995, recognising a total of 25 years' service, and this year he received a special medal for 60 years' CFS service.

Norm received the OAM in the 2009 Queen's Birthday Honours List, *"For service to the community, and to the road transport and fertiliser industries"*.

Ken says that he and Norm spent 15 or so years on the Murraylands Regional Development Board and the senior executive before that structure was changed to another entity by the Government. Ken and Di attended the Memorial Service at the Murray Bridge Racing Club on 19 July.





STUDENT CITIZENSHIP AWARDS 2024

Nominations for this year's Student Citizenship Awards closed on Monday 29 July.

Members of the Assessment and Selection Panel have been busily reading through and sorting the submissions accompanying the 49 nominations.

This is a greater response than in previous years. Once again, the calibre and achievements of the young people nominated by their schools have been outstanding and most impressive.

Nominations were received from 35 senior schools and colleges across the State, and included 11 Catholic colleges, 12 state secondary schools/colleges, one Islamic college, 3 Lutheran and 8 Independent schools/colleges.

There were 8 schools from country areas, and overall 14 schools nominated two students, which is the maximum number of nominations permitted from an individual school.

Of the total nominations, there were 15 boys and 34 girls, with 8 nominations of Year 11 students and 41 nominations of Year 12 students.

Marking of the submissions is now complete and the Panel has been busy preparing and writing a short, personalised testament for inclusion on the certificate for each student.

Before framing, each certificate is read and signed by the Governor of South Australia, our Branch Patron, Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, and the Branch Chair Tony Metcalf OAM.

The Top 10 recipients will receive a special plaque in front of parents, school principals and guests at a reception to be held at Government House on Monday 25 November, when one of these students will be announced by Her Excellency as the 2024 Student Citizen of the Year.

Along with a special cased medallion donated by our late member Keith (Chook) Fowler OAM, the balance of the certificates will be presented by members of the Association to the successful students at school assemblies in Term 4.

MEDAL NEWS

Just like having the full-size medals mounted, there are some general guidelines for having miniature medals mounted for wear.

Miniature medals may be worn swing-mounted, individually suspended from a brooch bar. They may also be court-mounted, where the medals are secured to a backing board of matching ribbons.

Their size permits miniature medals to be typically mounted side-by-side. In large groups however, the medals and ribbons may be partially overlapped to reduce the overall size of the brooch. In all cases, the ribbon of the most senior medal is seen in full, and each award successively overlaps the next.

A major difference with miniature groups is that the insignia of neck decorations are included – including Officer and above in the Order of Australia, Commander and above in the Order of St John, the insignia of a Knight Bachelor, the higher grades of imperial honours, and certain decorations.

An example of a group of swingmounted miniatures, including the Victoria Cross (VC) and Military Medal (MM) for bravery during World War 1, and the Jubilee Medal of King George V (1935) and the Coronation Medal of King George VI (1937).



A set of swing-mounted miniatures with the ribbons and medals partially overlapped, including a Distinguished Service Order (DSO) and Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE, post-1937 pattern); the last medal is a Military Order of Aviz (Republic of Portugal, post-1917).

An example of a group of courtmounted miniature medals; the second last medal is the Outstanding Achievement Medal of the Republic of the Philippines – the full-size medal is worn as a neck decoration, but the miniature is worn mounted on the brooch of miniature medals.
