The Order of Australia Association NSW 2024 King's Birthday New Recipients Reception was held on the 11th November at NSW Parliament House.

NSW Chairman, **Dr John Gullotta AM** extended a warm welcome to the 33 King's Birthday 2024 (KB24) new recipients present together with their family and friends.

Being a special day, Remembrance Day, KB24 New Recipient, **Brigadier Brendan Casey AM** was asked to recite the Ode followed by a minute silence.

Dr Gullotta continued "We are a much smaller and cosier number this year as 38% less awards were given this year compared to previous years due to a new computer nomination system being implemented and we have been assured that the process will be faster in future.

This event is an opportunity for our Association to celebrate your great achievements. Every year I am truly amazed by the extremely high caliber of recipients that are honored and all of you here today are certainly no exception. You come from all walks of life, a myriad of professions and of course the quiet achievers working away in your local communities especially in rural and remote parts of NSW. All of you have an unique and special story that you should be very proud of and that we acknowledge and honour here today.

I would like to welcome and thank **Stephanie Di Pasqua MP**, member for Drummoyne for being our parliamentary host and **Prof Tracey O'Brien AM**, NSW Chief Cancer Officer, Chief Executive Officer of the Cancer Institute NSW and NSW KB24 New Recipient, for agreeing to be our special guest speaker. Prof O'Brien AM is a globally recognised Oncologist and researcher, actively engaged in the forefront of cancer care. She was made a Member of the Order of Australia for significant service to cancer medicine, to medical research and education, and to professional bodies. Tracey was "in conversation" with NSW Branch Committee Member **Sophie Scott OAM** who with 20 plus years as an award-winning medical TV journalist for the ABC, is now an international speaker and educator with expertise in mental health and wellbeing. Sophie received an Order Of Australia Medal for her service to broadcast media, and to community health.

As you all know, membership is the lifeblood of any organization. So if you are not a member of the association please join so you can help us to celebrate and promote outstanding citizenship! Next year we will also be holding member networking events at no cost so fellow awardees can meet and exchange stories." Dr Gullotta said.





Dr Gullotta then called upon a very special lady and KB24 New recipient, **Sister Helen Merrin OAM** to say Grace.

Sister Merrin OAM is St Lucy's School's Chaplain, where she has been working for over 30 years including when they were a school for students with vision impairments. Sr Helen has been a Dominican Sister for 60 years, she became blind as an adult, and subsequently developed a significant hearing impairment and now uses cochlear implants in both ears.

She continues to inspire our community with her dedication to Catholic education and special needs children. "We are all so proud of your achievements and honoured that you are saying Grace for us today", Dr Gullotta said.

Our Hon Secretary, **Dianne North OAM** proposed a Toast to the New Recipients which was followed by a Toast to the Order of Australia Association on behalf of all the KB24 New recipients by **His Honour Judge Rolf Driver AM.**

Judge Driver AM was a Judge of the Federal Court of Australia and Family Court of Australia before his retirement in August 2022. Prior to being appointed Judge he was a Senior Government Solicitor at the Australian Government. He is the former Chair of the Australian Chapter of the International Association of Refugee and Migration Judges and is a KB24 Order of Australia New Recipient.

Our Hon. Treasurer **Mrs Louise Paisley OAM**, extended thanks to Judge Driver AM on behalf of the Association and then proceeded to give the Loyal Toast to The King.

It was a most enjoyable luncheon with excellent networking between all new recipients who exchanged life stories and memories with friends and family.

NSW Branch Christmas Luncheon 30th November 2024

The NSW Branch held its annual Christmas Luncheon in the beautiful Cellos Grand Dining room at the Castlereagh boutique hotel.

NSW Branch Chairman, **Dr John Gullotta AM**, extended a warm welcome to all members and honours recipients present as well as their family and guests. He especially welcomed the guest speaker **Martha Jabour OAM**, recently named our 2025 NSW Local Hero and who is also our NSW Branch Deputy Chair. "We are all very proud of Martha and her achievements" he said. Her introduction read:

Martha Jabour OAM helped establish the Homicide Victims Support Group in 1993 to care for families and friends of homicide victims throughout NSW.

It provides life-changing counselling, support and referrals to more than 4,200 members. Using her experience across grief, trauma, policy development, strategic planning and crisis management, in 2013, Martha developed a vision for a world-first trauma recovery facility for those impacted by homicide.

She inspired politicians, public servants, community organisations and others to raise funds, while land for the facility was donated by Blacktown City Council and the Western Sydney Parklands Trust. Grace's Place opened in 2023.

In April 2024, Grace's Place provided care for the overseas families of the victims of a Sydney shopping centre attack, including accommodation, counselling and funeral assistance.

Martha is also a community member representative on the NSW State Parole Authority, representing the families of homicide victims once an inmate becomes eligible for parole.

She was recently named 2025 NSW Local Hero.


Martha gave a very moving account of her achievements and work over the years that led to the opening of Grace's Place as well as her recognition for all her hard work, devotion and dedication to the cause of victims of homicide and also the community at large.

Dr Gullotta went on to say, "Today is an opportunity for members and guests to celebrate the beginning of the Christmas season but also to raise money for the Order of Australia Association Foundation. The Foundation supports our next generation of leaders by helping promising young Australians to achieve their potential for the benefit of future generations of Australians. It represents an investment in Australia's future.

The Scholarship programme aims to identify full-time students in their second year of university who are exceptional in their field of study, who have given back to the community, and who can benefit from the financial support provided by the Scholarship. It is hoped these students have the potential to become future awardees of the Order of Australia. The recipient receives \$40,000 paid over two years. For the students selected, the value of the Scholarship is life changing. In addition, the recipient receives mentorship from a member of the Order of Australia in the student's area of expertise and career ambition. Winners have described this as having a benefit beyond money. The scholarship is highly regarded not just by the recipients but also by the universities that we work with.

That prestige is enhanced by the presentation of the Scholarship awards by the Governor-General at the National Conference Gala Dinner of which the next one will be in Sydney on the 3rd May 2025. By next year, 60 scholarships will have been awarded since inception. Our NSW Branch has committed to donating a Scholarship as hosts of the National Conference and are most delighted to support this worthy cause."

The audience was entertained by pianist, Jason Xuong from the University of Sydney Piano Society, with Christmas Carols sung by vocalist Cana. Everyone had a fantastic afternoon of networking and engaging conversations. It was a great start to the festive holiday season!

Neither is sitting back on his laurels with Richard continuing his valued Community work in Mogo and Michael continuing his work focusing on International Relations and Education primarily in Asia.

For several years the Far South Coast Group sponsored young people on the sailing ship the Young Endeavour and the responses from the recipients were gratifying indeed. These young people presented at our meetings held after their return and their excitement was palpable. They all claimed it was the most wonderful, and at times, challenging experience of their lives and of course, this has been the whole idea.

Sadly, this option is no longer available for our Group to support. We are endeavouring to encourage new Awardees to become Members of the Association but feel we do require a regional purpose which would entice them to join. Otherwise, it is simply a cup of tea, light refreshments, well done, see you later, not the sort of function to which well-motivated, energetic people would be attracted.
